When an emergency arises representatives from the schools, electric companies, representatives from the lodging and food industries, and others gather at the building so they can quickly work to manage resources to meet the challenges of the situation. In the off season or between emergencies, the members of the Emergency Management team work to provide community education on how to get ready for an emergency (i.e., building Bucket of supplies that may be needed, making a plan for what to do and where to meet in an emergency, how to stay informed)
