Wafa shared one of the murals the children had made as well as prepared a canvas for us to participate in starting one for our chapters. We were given the opportunity to complete a segment of the canvas or to take one home to make to send back to be added to the work-in-progress.

This program has involved high school student as well who can earn service hours toward graduation by participating.
