
About Rhonda: After completing her B.S. degree in speech-pathology at Northwestern University, Rhonda moved to Broward County, Florida to work in the public school system. In 1961, she was invited to become a charter member of Alpha Pi chapter. Little did she know at that time what paths she would travel. In Alpha Pi, she served in several capacities and was elected president. During that time, she received a sabbatical to finish my M.A. in communication disorders at the University of Florida. A move to Tallahassee F in 1975 to work at the Florida Department of Education offered the opportunity to transfer to Alpha Kappa chapter where she served in several roles before becoming president in 1984. She completed her Ph.D. in educational leadership from Florida State University while working and continuing her activities with Alpha Kappa. In 2000, she accepted the role of chapter treasurer and have held that position to this day. In addition to chapter activities, she is financial manager for the Big Bend Coordinating Council and has been, at the request of four different district directors, treasurer for District 1. DKG Hurricane Ian Classroom Supply Collection - Nancy Rosenbaum

Englewood Elementary School in Englewood, Florida was damaged during Hurricane Ian. AK members reached out with enthusiasm toward making donations of school supplies and monetary contributions. The chapter raised over \$200! Additionally, other chapters in the BBCC were offered the opportunity to help and contributed supplies as well. There were so many supplies that items had to be taken to Englewood in two loads, one in December and another in February. The President of the PTA started a Teacher Supply Closet with these supplies so that teachers can obtain what they need when they need it. They have been so thankful to have our support! The Second Harvest of the Big Bend "Back Pack" program (3rd year) provides 1,200 bags of nutritious food to food insecure students every week. Donations grow their ability to feed more students this school year. Without this important program, students may go hungry over the weekend and return to school distracted and struggle to reach their full potential. Since 2010, the Backpack Program has provided more than 1,000 bags of food weekly to children in the Big Bend Area. In Leon County alone, over 30 percent of our children in Tallahassee are food insecure. Funds from our chapter budget are contributed to this program.

World Fellowship - DKG promotes professional and personal growth of its members and excellence in education. The World Fellowship Fund was established to provide opportunities for women from foreign countries to pursue graduate studies in Canada and the United States. We collect coins at each meeting to give to World Fellowship. Last year we gave \$295.00. Thank you, Alpha Kappa members!

We begin 2023-2024 dues collection for the Delta Kappa Gamma Society in April. Active dues are \$85 and Reserve dues are \$35. Reserve dues are available only to members who are unable tom participate in the activities of the chapter due to physical disability or geographic location.

Currently, Rhonda Work is working with Envision Credit Union to establish a payment option based on something like Pay Pal or Zelle. She should have that information within a week or so.
