

Credentials Report

170 registrants

154 in attendance

48 chapters represented

14 first timers

36 registered by cell phone

Overall, membership declined by 2%; anticipated that it would be a 5% decline.

The organization is at a crossroads, but leadership remains hopeful.



A measure passed in 2022 eliminating Induction Fees.

There was a budget adjustment in response to costs that increased, for example, an increase in software costs.

Some costs increased, others did not. Overall expenses were less than budgeted. There are reserves to cover if needed.

There are one half the number of members in the state than there were 15 years ago. This is a nationwide situation.

Bylaws Committee Report

The Bylaws approved in 2023. Request made for chapters to have representation on the Bylaws committee.

Communications Committee Report

A request was made for representation from the Chapters. Elinor Mount Simmons from District 1 had a display of samples of newsletters from District 1 chapters. **Dr. Hayes heard many oohs and aahs from those looking through Connie Lewis' handiwork.**

World Fellowship Committee

Three million eight hundred six thousand dollars have been awarded since 1960 to one thousand women in one hundred twenty-two countries.

Florida

In 2023 15 women received \$4k each; 3 received 1k each and 8 received \$500 for a total of \$67k for 26 women in 23 counties.



Education Foundation

In 2017, 13 professional development awards were issued.

This year, 23 awards totaling \$30,153 for 7 grant recipients.

The deadline for applications for the 2024 awards is February 1, 2024

New Business

A motion was made and seconded for the dissolution of Alpha Sigma and Nu Chapters effective immediately. Approved

Motions were separately made to merge Alpha Beta and Beta Pi in District 2 and to merge Beta Psi with Beta Chi in District 4. Both were approved.

A motion was made and seconded to change the name of Beta Theta to Beta Theta Tampa Bay to facilitate access and location. This was approved by 2/3 of those present.

Delivery to Lundquist House - Nancy Watson reported that Shannon Biassou is again our liaison and Gabby Fortuna is now house manager. There are currently 15 ladies in the house this term. Felicia Jordan-Jackson will once again be working with Nancy. Thank you, Nancy for dropping off all these supplies to the house. The ladies were very excited to receive them.
