

Here's how we'll have fun raising money for World Fellowship

Alpha Kappa members donate new or *nearly* new items to be auctioned. Bring your items to our Dec. 7 meeting at 6 p.m. Do NOT wrap your items. Please donate items that your sisters will want to buy. Think about items that might be worth \$10 or more.



If you donate smaller items that can be grouped into one "lot" as one item for auction – that works, too. Each member may donate up to three items (or lots). *Each member will earn one bid ticket for each item/lot she donates.*

2. All items will be displayed on tables at our meeting; a cup will be placed in front of each item/lot.

3. Members buy tickets (\$1 each, or 7 for \$5, or 15 for \$10). These are numbered rafflestyle tickets. The buyer tears her tickets in half, keeping one side and depositing the other side of a ticket in the cup of the item on which she is bidding.



4. When the auction opens, members browse the tables and bid for the items/lots they want by depositing tickets in the cups in front of the lots. The more tickets a member places in a cup, the more likely she is to win the item!

5. When the auction closes, our Auctioneer draws one ticket from each cup and announces the winning ticket number. The winner may collect her item(s) immediately.
