About the Big Bend Community Orchestra and the Artist Series

of Tallahassee Founders

At the suggestion of **Ginny Densmore**, a retired elementary music teacher and clarinetist, Waldie Anderson, a retired university professor and performer, co-founded the Big Bend Community Orchestra (BBCO) with her in the spring of 1994. With the help of Carolyn Bridger, Waldie's wife and FSU music professor, The Artist Series of Tallahassee was formed in 1995 to provide the orchestra with a way to raise needed funds as well as to meet the need for performances of world class classical music for the community since FSU had dropped its series after many years.



In 2000 an Artist in Residence program was initiated by The Artist Series which reaches hundreds of school children. In 2007 the BBCO began its Young Artist Competition which provides local music students ages 7-18 a chance to compete to win prize money as well as chance to play a solo with the orchestra. In 2009 the orchestra formed its own non-profit 501(c)3 in order to free the Artist Series of its obligation to BBCO as the orchestra was now able support itself. The BBCO celebrated its 25th Anniversary in the spring of 2019, and The Artist Series is celebrating its 25th year during the 2019-2020 season. Waldie Anderson passed away in 2011 and Carolyn Bridger followed in 2014. Ginny Densmore currently serves as Historian on the BBCO Board of Directors and also volunteers in the Artist Series Guild which supports The Artist Series with fundraising efforts.
