

The committee shall support programs of action that promote the personal well-being, intellectual growth, and global awareness of women educators; encourage a focus on the arts at international conventions, regional conferences, and state organization conventions and develop strategies that will enable chapters to encourage members to become leaders. #### **Advocating for DKG Members: The Legislative Committee Meets with Florida Legislator**

During the 2nd virtual "Rally in Tally" on Tuesday, November 30, 2021, the concerns of DKG members were presented to the Florida Legislature by the Florida State Organization Legislative Committee. A full day of interviews with members of both the House and Senate were scheduled, and eleven legislators were interviewed. DKG members, as well as members of several partnering organizations, joined throughout the day to hear these legislators discuss their plans for the 2022 legislative session and their responses to the four Issues of Concern of DKG members.

In addition to hearing from legislators, Rally participants were shown how to navigate the Florida House and Senate websites, locate their elected representatives, and track bills that have been proposed for the next session. Information was presented about the redistricting process that is currently underway, and participants were informed about how to access the redistricting website for information and to post comments.





## Florida Legislators' Day

DKG Florida State members met with Florida legislators on Tuesday, February 8th, 2022. Vivian Posey, Chair of the DKG State Legislative Committee and the DKG membership spoke with many Senators and

Representatives. The Florida DKG members shared

their issues of concern which included:

- School safety for students, faculty and staff during pandemic/endemics.
- Uniform accountability and transparency for all schools that receive public funds.
- Mental health services for staff and studentsexpand allocation.
- Reinstatement of the traditional defined Pension Plan as the default for new teachers hired in the 2022-2023 school year.

## A Tribute to Merle Jones

Merle Stiller Jones of Chipley, FL was born on September 22nd, 1936 in Washington County, FL and passed from this life on February 8th, 2022 at Flowers Hospital in Dothan, AL.

Merle was a very active member of the Delta Kappa Gamma International Society, the Wausau United Methodist Church, the Wausau Garden Club and the Washington County Friends of the Library.

Her educational experience spanned 38 years, primarily within Washington County School District. She began teaching at Wausau Elementary School before completion of her degree. She taught at Kate M. Smith Elementary School for 20 years. During these years she completed coursework in FSU/UWF Cooperative Doctoral Program.



Subsequently, Merle served as assistant principal at both Kate Smith Elementary and Roulhac Middle School. From 1993 until 1995 she was principal of Vernon Elementary School where she retired. During her educational career Merle also served as an adjunct professor at Chipola, the University of West Florida, and Florida State University. Following her retirement, she served as a volunteer consultant and worked briefly at Panhandle Area Educational Cooperative. Her experience as an educator made her a tireless advocate for legislation that would affect children. Unbeknownst to many, Merle's career also included teaching swimming, summer athletics, Physical Education and Adult Education.

The Florida Delta Kappa Gamma Educational Foundation was dear to Merle who worked hard to have it established during her biennium as State President and served on the board since its founding. She was a member of Delta Theta Chapter, initiated in 1987.

Merle was also dedicated to working on the State Legislative Committee. She participated in the rallies in Tallahassee and the National Legislative Seminars in Washington, DC, to visit legislators in person (once during blinding, blowing sleet, and frigid temperatures) to advocate for funding for traditional public education and the rights of women and children.
