Please join us on Friday, July 27 in the afternoon at 3:30 p.m. for the U. S. Forum session at the International Convention. We have scheduled a dynamic speaker to begin the session and will have floor discussions of current legislative issues. We also need your input on what specific pieces of legislation are of most interest to you. Surveys from Delta Kappa Gamma as well as from AARP will be distributed at that session.

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT (VAWA) -- UPDATE

The Senate has passed its version of the Violence Against Women Act (S. 1925). The House of Representatives passed its version of VAWA (H.R. 4197); however, the two bills are not the same. According to the American Association of University Women, "The House-passed legislation would undermine many current programs and doesn't contain the necessary provisions to improve safety on college campuses. It also expressly rejects protections for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Americans."

PAYCHECK FAIRNESS ACT REINTRODUCED

Senator Barbara Mikulski has reintroduced the Paycheck Fairness Act (S. 797). There are currently 35 cosponsors to the bill. To see if your senator is a cosponsor go to <http://thomas.loc.gov/cgi-bin/bdquery/D?d112:2:./temp/~bdXiEk:@@@P/home/LegislativeData.php> The House version is H.R. 1519.
