Dr. Margaret Trybus (lota), Recording Secretary, reported that a quorum was present with 81 of 101 voting members in attendance (27 state officers/chairs/past state presidents and 54 chapter presidents). Seven nonvoting Executive Board members and six guests also attended.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE TO APPROVE MINUTES OF APRIL 27, 2019 EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Patricia Gaines (Alpha Delta), Chair, reported that the committee of Pam Rightsel (Beta) and Barbara Bergdolt (Gamma) reviewed and approved the minutes of the April 27, 2019 Executive Board Meeting as printed and distributed.

COMMITTEE TO APPROVE MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 21, 2019 EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Christine Berto (Nu), Chair, and the committee of Mary Kay Gatchel (Alpha Zeta) and Pamela Rightsel (Beta) were appointed to approve the minutes of the September 21, 2019 meeting.

REVIEW OF EXECUTIVE BOARD & EXECUTIVE

COMMITTEE ACTIONS SINCE APRIL 27, 2019 Margaret Trybus (lota), Recording Secretary, reported the Executive Board approved the motion sent July 17, 2019 that read: The 2019-2021 biennial pins be purchased at a cost not to exceed \$900 to be borrowed from the Reservation Fund. The Reservation Fund will be reimbursed as the pins are sold with the proceeds of those pins going to the Grant-In-Aid Fund.

The Executive Committee approved a \$5000 anonymous donation for Women in the Arts Special Projects.

CORRESPONDENCE

Pam Painter (Chi), Corresponding Secretary, received and read thank you correspondence from Dr. Debbie LeBlanc, Patricia Walsh, and Diane Kovach.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Bev Johns (Alpha Phi), President, challenged members to have a "professional presence" in communicating and recruiting Delta Kappa Gamma on social media and in chapter areas. The Illinois Teacher Leadership Summit will continue and members were encouraged to share information with schools that might want to participate. She thanked all the chapters for being on the DKG "team," and expressed gratitude for making a difference in many lives, including hers.

OTHER OFFICERS AND PERSONNEL

RECORDING SECRETARY Dr. Margaret Trybus (lota), Recording Secretary, gave no report.

TREASURER

Sharon Vinson (Zeta), Treasurer, explained the available funds, receipts, disbursements, and investments for 2018-19. The balances show stability, anticipated receipts were exceeded, and expenses were exceeded. All funds met audit criteria. The membership report to date for 2019-2020 is 2093 active, 236 reserve, 13 collegiate, 42 honorary, and 5 active life for a total of 2,389 Illinois members.

Loryann Eis (Beta Epsilon) moved the 2018-19 audit of DKG Illinois State Organization financial records and a financial review of Lambda State Foundation for Educational Studies, Inc. which were completed by Hoffman and Tranel, CPA, Rock Island be accepted.

EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT

Dr. Kammie Richter (Xi), Executive Assistant, reported and noted updates to the directory. Information was shared on the initiative to celebrate women educators.

EDITOR

Pat DeWitt (Zeta), Editor, encouraged members to share successes in the *Newscaster* and explained submission guidelines.

HISTORIAN

Lou Ann Jacobs (Alpha Beta), Historian, noted guidelines for committee records delivered to the Joan Rayfield Archives at Illinois State University are forthcoming. Chapter presidents need to prepare a short history of the biennium for inclusion in the archives.

WEBMASTER

Rene DeGuzman (Beta Phi), Webmaster, described upcoming updates to the website and encouraged members to use the DKG ILSO Facebook group to promote chapter activities.

PD COORDINATOR

Cheryl Cox (Gamma Upsilon), Professional Development Coordinator, reported 22 chapters offered 84 different professional development sessions during 2018-19. PD requests require one month for processing. After an event, a summary, evaluation, and attendance form should be sent to the PD Coordinator.

SOCIETY BUSINESS

CHAPTER VISITATION

Pam Painter (Chi), Chapter Visitation Chair, encouraged chapters to continue to meet with Ambassadors and to work toward meeting their goals. Struggling chapters will be assigned an Ambassador with whom to consult. Criteria for struggling chapters may include a loss of five or more members, non-attendance at Executive Board, or reports from previous biennia.

COMMUNICATIONS AND MARKETING Mary Jane Sterling (Nu), Communications and Marketing Chair, reported on the *Teaming Up for Success in Leadership and Technology*. Due to an anonymous DKG donor, budget was met. Evaluations were positive. Chapter presidents were encouraged to submit member email address changes to aid in technology interest surveys.

Mary Jane Sterling (Nu), moved that a stipend of \$1,000 be paid to Rene DeGuzman as Webmaster in January 2020.

EVENT PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT

Sylvia Olson (Alpha Nu), Event Planning and Management Chair, expressed thanks to Melinda Davis (Alpha Theta) for a six-year tenure as chair. Registration opens January 1, 2020 for the state convention, April 24-26, 2020 in St. Louis, Mo. Meals need to be purchased to make minimum contract numbers which help with meeting room compensation. The proposed site for the April 2021 ILSO Convention is the Double Tree in Oak Brook. The 2022 ILSO Convention will be in the central part of the state.

Sylvia Olson (Alpha Nu) moved the Double Tree by Hilton in Oak Brook, IL, be approved as the site of the April 23-25, 2021 DKG Illinois State Organization Convention.

FINANCE

Loryann Eis (Beta Epsilon), Finance Chair, reported she had received 38 chapter budgets. Chapters were encouraged to consider changing budget approval times in the spring to be prepared for dues collection between April 1 and June 30. Changes to state committee budgets for 2020-21 should be sent to Loryann so the committee can prepare a budget for convention in April 2020.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT Debbie Lambeth (Sigma), Leadership Development Chair, stated the Leadership Academy/Training for Chapter Leaders for President, Educational Excellence, Communications and Marketing, Treasurer, and Finance leaders will be held April 24, 2020 in St. Louis, Bradley University on June 6, 2020, and Bloomington July 16, 2020. The Illinois Teacher Leadership Summit will be March 6-7, 2020. Locations and details are on the website. The committee is working on changing the arrangements for the Leadership and Technology Workshops with the Communications and Marketing Committee.

MEMBERSHIP

Linda Adcock (Beta Phi) Membership Chair, thanked chapters for providing leadership and challenged chapters to recruit at least one member by the April 2020 convention. Form 6 Death of Member Report should be sent to Sharon Vinson (Zeta), Treasurer, and Linda Adcock (Beta Phi), Membership Chair. Bev Johns (Alpha Phi), President, requested names of new members and a list of their school superintendents. She will contact superintendents to inform them of member induction into DKG.

NOMINATIONS

Dr. Debbie LeBlanc (Beta Phi), Nominations Chair, encouraged chapters to identify and inspire members to accept leadership roles in the coming biennium. Current chapter presidents should identify chapter presidents for 2020-2022 and submit the form to Dr. Debbie LeBlanc. Monthly tips will be provided to incoming leaders and attendance at Leadership Academy/Training for Chapter Leaders is encouraged. Members are encouraged to apply for international committees.

PERSONNEL

LaVonne Chaney (Beta Pi), Personnel Chair, recognized employees Pat DeWitt (Zeta), Editor, Kammie Richter (Xi), Executive Assistant, and Sharon Vinson (Zeta), Treasurer. The Personnel Committee is working to fill the position of treasurer, and the application for the position is on the website. Once named, the candidate will be mentored by Sharon Vinson (Zeta) from January-June 30. A \$500 stipend (from a member donation) will be paid to the candidate to mentor with Sharon. The candidate will be presented for employment at the April 2020 Executive Board meeting. LaVonne reported Pat DeWitt's (Zeta) ten-year term as editor expires in July 2020. The committee will work to hire a new editor, and an application for this position is on the website.

LaVonne Chaney (Beta Pi) moved that the Personnel Committee select a Treasurer candidate for a mentoring program with the Illinois State Organization Treasurer. A \$500 stipend will be paid, the stipend coming from a donation for this purpose.

Chapters should provide an electronic copy of updated chapter rules to the ILSO Rules Chair after chapter approval.

The history of Illinois State Organization (formerly known as Lambda State) shall be continued by a publication every ten (10) years of the significant events, achievements, and programs of that decade. 9/19

A. Items which may be sold at conventions include convention favors, convention decorations, Art Mart items, Chapter Bazaar items, **vendor/exhibitor items**, and State Planning Committee approved items. **9/19**

A member who severs her connection with the Society **may** be encouraged to return her official Society jewelry to the chapter. **9/19**
