With the launch of the new DKG website in January, members must sign in to access member resources, register for events, and order from the Society Store.

- Use the six-digit Member-ID as the username (first six digits of publication labels or the number on the member ID card). Chapter president and treasurer also have this information.
- Use the default password, dkg2014society, for the first log in. (The password may be changed after log in, if preferred).
