Parliamentary Note

- The By-Laws/ Standing Rules Committee will make a motion at Executive Board to approve the entire package of changes.
- Any member of the Executive Board may support the motion, but request that any items may be pulled from the proposals and discussed separately. If no one requests an item or items to be discussed, voting takes place.
- The presiding officer restates the question to place the motion before the assembly except the items to be discussed. It takes a 2/3 majority of voting members to pass.
- Discussion of the excluded or pulled item(s) takes place. At the conclusion of the discussion the presiding officer restates the question and voting takes place. A 2/3 majority of voting members is required to pass.
- All items passed at Executive Board allows the proposals to go to the General Membership meeting on Saturday for consideration.
- The same procedure will be followed at the General Membership meeting.
- Any member present may vote and be part of the discussion. A 2/3 majority of voting members is required to pass.
