Letters to the Editor

Starting with the Winter edition of 2010, the *Bulletin* includes a new feature, "Letters to the Editor Q&A." The purpose of this new initiative is to provide information about the *Bulletin's* mandate and editorial decision-making processes in a brief, concise format. In the first installment, Editor, Dr. Lace Marie Brogden discusses "How are Letters to the Editor selected for publication?"

Three key questions are posed before publishing a letter to the editor. They are

1. Is the letter likely to generate interest for the readership?
- the relevance question

2. Does the letter comment on a specific aspect, positive or negative, of recently published material or of the *Bulletin's* overall presentation?
- the content question

3. Because the *Bulletin* is a peer-reviewed, academic journal, how does the letter address or discuss the academic merit of *Bulletin* content?
- the mandate question
