M. P.S. E.R. S. Bill Clears Senate With Defined Contribution For New Hires

After much anticipation, the Senate today passed major reform to the Michigan Public School Employee Retirement System by a 20-18 vote with various changes, including a defined contribution for all new hires.

An amendment adopted by the Senate to SB 1040 that was offered by Sen. Mark Jansen (R-Gaines Township) would force all new public school employees hired on or after July 1, 2013 into a 401(k) - style defined contribution system similar to what state employees currently have.

"If we had done something like this in the middle 90s, we probably would have a zero liability," he said, as opposed to the system's \$45 billion unfunded liability. "In the future, legislators will look back on this group as the Legislature that fixed an un-ended nightmare."

Another adopted amendment, presented by Sen. Tonya Schuitmaker (R-Lawton), calls for a 12-month study period in which seven of the state's universities - Central, Ferris State, Lake Superior State, Michigan Technological, Northern, Western and Eastern - would review their annual cost to the retirement system over the past five years of health care coverage benefits provided by MPSERS to the university's retired members.

An amendment by Sen. Phil Pavlov (R-St. Clair) was adopted alongside the S-2 version of the bill that would require a disclosure on the market-value discount rate that is used in calculating system liabilities, as well as the funding status of the system based on the market value of assets. The amendment also calls for a five-year projection of the annual level percentage payroll contribution rate from the state.

And an amendment from Sen. Patrick Colbeck (R-Canton Township) was adopted that would restore merit pay to final average compensation.

Overall, the other major components of the bill remain. Employees in the basic pension plan, essentially those hired before 1990, would go from making no contribution to their pension to 5 percent of their salary. The bulk of public school employees are in the Member Investment Plan and contribute 3.9 percent of their salary currently; they would see that amount rise to 8 percent. Employees could opt out of those increased amounts by taking a smaller multiplier or switching to a 401(k) -style system for future service.

Retirees would have to pay 20 percent of the premium for their health insurance, up from 10 percent. And new employees will not be eligible for retiree health insurance, instead setting up a 401(k) -type account where the state would match 2 percent of their salary that could be used toward retiree health care costs.

Democratic amendments to provide prefunding of the system were rejected. No prefunding of the system is in the bill. Gongwer News Service had more on this story in the Michigan Report.


