#### A New International Committee

The international Educational Excellence Committee is a brand new committee established by the 2010 international convention. Throughout the Society members have raised questions about this new committee and how it intends to carry out the responsibilities assigned to it in the DKG Constitution and Standing Rules. The room buzzed with excitement as the 15 members of the new Educational Excellence Committee met for the first time to build on the wisdom of the past as it charted its new course.

Focusing on the Society's mission and vision statements, the committee adopted a self-definition, which will be equally appropriate for state organization and chapter committees: "The Educational Excellence Committee promotes International projects, supports early-career educators, and encourages programs and activities that further educational excellence worldwide."

For the Society to have the greatest impact on education, chapters and state organizations need to focus on no more than two Society-wide initiatives. In addition, chapters and state organizations will benefit from resources for programs and activities that encourage educational excellence by addressing the professional and personal growth of women educators and the diverse interests of members.

To embrace our vision, "Leading Women Educators Impacting Education Worldwide," the Educational Excellence Committee urges every chapter and state organization throughout the Society to focus on two major initiatives: Support for the Society's official Schools for Africa project, and Support for early-career educators. Information on these initiatives is readily available on the DKG website and in its publications. UNICEF will maintain records of DKG's support for the Schools for Africa project. Chapters, on the other hand, should maintain a record of the money and the number of hours members spend in support for early-career educators. Recognition for support of both initiatives will be showcased at the 2012 convention. To assist chapters, the Educational Excellence Committee will use the DKG Web site library, the DKG Network and Society publications to offer ideas for programs and activities that focus on educational excellence, promote the DKG/UN relationship, increase members' global awareness, impact educational law and policy, and increase members' personal and professional pride.

Join the excitement! Unite with other Delta Kappa Gamma members as we become a global force in achieving educational excellence.

**Membership** (aging membership, retaining current members, and the inability to attract and initiate early career educators)

**Leadership** (lack of interest in serving as an officer and lack of interest and involvement beyond the chapter level)

**Finances** (loss of members because of dues increase and the necessity to hold non-dues fundraisers)

## **Rethinking Membership**

I was reading one of the many the state newsletters that I receive. This particular newsletter was from Indiana. The article address some ideas that chapters might use to increase membership. Please check out these simple steps to see if your chapter can benefit from any suggestions.

- Just ask someone.
- Advertise your chapter's good points.
- Contact principals and superintendents. We need administrators in our organization.
- Also send a note if a member receives recognition from DKG.
- Invite 2-3 women from the same school. Friends and co-workers help in an unfamiliar situation.
- Do you know a noted educational speaker who would be a good prospective member?
- Keep the business portion of the meeting short!
- Don't sit in cliques. Providing mixers might help.
- Have program ideas that teachers can use in the classroom.
- Change your thinking i.e., a martial arts program. Check new ideas from chapter newsletters and the international website.
- Offer mini-grants from your chapter.
- For retirees, meet at their facility or see to it they have transportation to the meeting.
- Have members fill out a form that includes: "Five friends I would like to invite." Then encourage action on their responses.
