# **Meeting Icebreaker**

Ice breakers can take various forms but those that seem the most popular and effective are those that promote interaction, sharing, and team building.

- 3. Name five people you care about.
- 4. Name five people who have brought you joy or make you feel cared for.
- 5. Name five heroes that have inspired you.

Point: The lesson is obvious: on a personal level, fame, wealth, and achievement pale in comparison to care and compassion.

The deadline to register without a late fee is September 24



If you are unable to attend, please let me know and be sure to send a member to represent your chapter. Members of Executive Board are asked to sign in. There will be assigned seats with name cards displayed.

In addition to the Executive Board meeting, there will be opportunities to meet other members from around the state, attend breakout sessions on a variety of topics, learn from a terrific keynote speaker at the Saturday luncheon and shop at the auction and sales room. Attendees have a chance to earn professional development credit, SCECHs, at the event. Here's a thought: ask members who are attending the conference to take notes at a session they attend and later share what they learned with the rest of your chapter. This could encourage others to attend next time. The registration form and hotel information were published in the summer issue of the *Wolverine*. portant.

# From the State President to Chapter Presidents

Dear Chapter Presidents,

Since the start of your term in July, I have sent you guite a few emails with attached forms. Paper copies of many of those forms will be given to you at the fall conference, but I wanted you to have the materials early so you can think and plan ahead. The Award of the Rose is an opportunity for chapters to be recognized for implanting best practices for successful, growing chapters. The President's Award is given to acknowledge chapters' growth. I would suggest that you share the list of requirements for each award with your chapter members and talk about how best to complete the checklists. As you accomplish a task, check it off and plan for the others. The awards are announced at the spring convention in May of 2015. It would be fabulous to have every chapter earn those awards!

Read through the information I sent on the Friend of Education Award. It honors a person or persons in your community who truly support education and students. It is also a wonderful way to showcase your chapter and DKG in the community. Find ways to publicize the presentation of the award. Let parents, students, school employees and local leaders and residents hear about DKG projects, educational goals and our recognition of others.

You will be asked to submit your yearbook and chapter newsletter for "evaluation". The process is meant to provide constructive criticism, giving you suggestions for improvement and for recognizing achievements and inclusions. Both are tools to use in communicating with members and help strengthen the chapter. Those forms have been sent to you. If you are submitting paper copies of your yearbook and checklist, it might be convenient to bring those to the conference and turn them in. Then check off number 6 on the Award of the Rose!

The state Nominations Committee is seeking names of members to serve as state organization officers and members of the next Nominations Committee. Those individuals are elected, not appointed. Getting involved at the state level is an exciting way to learn more about the Society and it's projects, goals and successes in supporting education, children and women. The form for submitting a nomination was sent to you, along with the list of

guidelines. The deadline to submit a nomination is November 1, 2014 (not 2015 as I typed on the form I sent you!)

Our state organization's publication, the *Wolverine*, is always full of information and news about the state events, chapters and members. Our editor, J-Jay Pechta, welcomes photos and news articles from chap-

ters. Share details on your projects, programs and speakers. Highlight your new officers and members in photos. Just keep in mind: it's better to share a picture of people doing something! 

Recommendations for State Officer or State Nominations
Committee

The following are suggested guidelines for considering a member for nomination.

- 1. Individual members or chapters may recommend a candidate.
- 2. The first and second vice presidents do not automatically advance to the presidency.
- 3. All regions of the state will be considered.
- 4. The nominee for state president is given the opportunity to select a corresponding secretary.
- 5. As a rule, we do not re-elect to the same office.
- 6. Nominees for state office should have served as chapter officers and/or committee chairpersons.
- 7. A nominee for state president should:a. have served as a chapter presidentb. have had state committee or office experiencec. be familiar with the work of the State Organization's Executive Boardd. have attended state and regional meetingse. have organizational skills, good speaking skills, and have time to devote to the Society.
- 8. The State Nominations Committee is composed of one member from each area of the state and includes:a. a past state organization president, b. a past chapter president, c. a current chapter president, d. two members-at-large, one of whom has state level experience.
- 9. Recommendations for a nomination should have chapter approval.
- 10. Only one form per nominee may be submitted. Support letters will NOT be considered.

The deadline for submitting recommendation forms is November 1, 2014.
