



SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

Thirty DKG scholarships are awarded each year to members pursuing advance degrees. Scholarships for those seeking a master's degree are \$6,000.00 and a doctorate is \$10,000.00. To be eligible, you must have been a member of DKG at least three years. The scholarship program achieves several of the Society's Seven Purposes. North Carolina



has been very fortunate to have had many recipients over the years including four Eta State sisters last year.

You should begin your application process now so you will have time to complete the application and secure letters of recommendations, transcripts and program documentation. The due date is February 1, 2014. The application can be found at: https://www.dkg.org/content/2014-2015-scholarship-application

Eta State sponsors \$4,000.00 academic scholarships for Doctoral and Sixth-Year graduate study, as well as smaller scholarships for either Master's level work requiring graduate school enrollment or non-degree activities, such as special projects, research, or certifications. You must have been a DKG member for two calendar years or more to be eligible to apply. Appli-cations for the Eta State Scholarship can be found online at:

Also, please alert qualified nonmembers who plan to pursue a degree in education of our \$500 Gamma Chi Grant-in-Aid. 
At the October meeting, \$55.00 was collected from the meeting raffle and will be used to help our local libraries.


Thank you, Gamma Chi Sisters, for paying your dues on time. Because of your diligence, I



DISCOVER WEB 2.0 APPS & WEBSITES



Web 2.0 refers to the read, write, interactive world of the Internet. With free tools over the Web, creating content of all kinds is easier than ever. Here are a few to try as published in the July/August 2013 DKG Presidents' Page, the July/August *DKG News and* summarized in the Fall *Eta State News:*

www.LiveBinders.com is an online three ring notebook which allows you to create organized binders for specific topics or search for other binders that have been created and shared with the public. Users have complete control of binders created..

www.Slideshare.com provides an online space to share Power-Point presentations. Upload a slide show and then provide an URL to members of an audience for later reference — makes paper handouts a thing of the past.

www.Prezi.com, an online presentation tool, completely changes how to create a visual presentation. Presentations can be shared online or downloaded to your computer and shared without connectivity.

www.Blogger.com is an easy to use blog site. Sign up through a Google account. Blogger lets you choose an attractive design template with a variety of layout options. One can easily begin a blog for work, school, church, or home on any topic. Import images to support your blog writing. Publish and share blog postings.

www.Flickr.com is an online photo storage space. Share and organize your photos. Create a new account or log in with a Google, Yahoo or Facebook account. All photos uploaded are viewable by other Flickr members. Fees provide additional storage.

www.Animoto.com is an online space for building a video slideshow. Users can upload pictures, add visual elements and music to create a personal video show. You may choose to upload music you have purchased or add more options with additional fees. Sign up as an educator for a larger limit. For the educators' link go to http://animoto.com/education.

Picasa Web, another online photo storage space, provides similar features to Flickr. Users can log in with a Google account, share images, create tags and add more storage with inexpensive fees. Download the **Picasa** program to your computer for managing your digital images on your computer. **http://picasa.google.com/**

Jing allows users to create a quick video or picture of what is done on a computer screen. This program is available from TechSmith at http://www.techsmith.com/jing/

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – OCTOBER 3, 2013

The Gamma Chi Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met on Thursday, October 3, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of Enterprise Baptist Church in Littleton, North Carolina. (Prior to the meeting, Sylvia Alston and Nancy Tunstall conducted the Initiation Ceremony for Heidi Hogan since she and her husband had to leave to attend a close family friend's funeral.) An Initiation Ceremony was held for Tracey Neal who could not be with us last May. It was conducted by Nancy Tunstall, Sylvia Alston, Mary Brodie Raiford and Sallye Duncan. Members sang the Delta Kappa Gamma song at the conclusion of the ceremony. Lynn Meyers gave the blessing and members and guests enjoyed a meal prepared by Robert Harris.

After dinner, Sylvia Alston introduced our speaker, Representative Michael Wray. In appreciation of his visit, President Nancy Tunstall presented Rep. Wray with a stained glass Patriotic Heart, a Gamma Chi calculator and a pack of M&Ms in recognition of our new state project of Mentoring Members (M&Ms).

President Nancy Tunstall called the meeting to order. Thirty-three members were present along with two guests. A moment of silence was observed in memory of Betsy Brown. Her memorial service will be held next May.

The minutes were approved as corrected: (Executive Board Minutes – Noel Robertson's last name was misspelled and the total available for budgeting, \$6,305.41, should have been listed instead of the total estimated receipts, \$5,670.00). Treasurer Shirley White reported a savings balance of \$3,535.71 and a checkbook balance of \$327.87.

Corresponding Secretary Sallye Duncan reported the following regrets: Mary Catherine Harris (at Springbook Retreat leading a writing workshop), Connie King (family commitment), Debra Clayton (preparing for son's wedding), Brenda Fuller (caretaker for husband) and Trina Paynter (attending NC State Library Conference). Sympathy cards were sent to Jill Coleman and the family of Betsy Brown. Get well cards were sent to Harriett Faulkner and Sue Skinner. Thank you cards were received from Jill Coleman (for acts of kindness to her family after her brother's death), and Melissa Hunter and Morgan Leigh Coleman (for their grants-in-aid).

A number of our members were recognized for various accomplishments. In Laura Kearney's absence, Sylvia Alston will take her a rose in honor of her retirement. Nancy Tunstall recognized members with birthdays in August, September and October. Shirley White presented Nancy with a rose for her birthday. Congratulations go to Kristen Boyd, one of the three finalists for Vance County Schools Assistant Principal of the Year and to Karen Paynter, Teacher of the Year at South Warren. Kristen will find out November 5th if she was chosen. Although no longer a Gamma Chi member, Donna Smith is Aycock's Teacher of the Year. One of our guests, Jessica Williams, whom our chapter sponsored, shared her experience at this summer's Leadership Development Seminar.

Jeffrey Evans reported on our Executive Board meeting.

Nancy Tunstall gave the President's Report. Nancy attended the Eta State Executive Board Meeting on September 14th which was filled with energy and excitement. Our Eta State Education Foundation is on the way to becoming a reality. When it is approved, the state will be able to receive funds which will be tax deductible for the donor. Other items discussed were membership and how each chapter needed to focus on the 3 R's: Recruit, Retain and Reinstate. Eta State President Pat Taylor urged all chapters to pursue Eta State's 2013-2015 state project of mentoring members, M&Ms. To that end, members were asked to fill out an M&Ms questionnaire before they left, if possible. They were rewarded with a bag of M&Ms. Danylu Hundley and Sylvia Alston have agreed to be team leaders to help analyze these questionnaires and make recommendations at our next meeting of ways that we can assist our members and beginning teachers. As Regional Director, Nancy visited two Wake County chapters last week: Gamma lota on September 24th and Gamma Omicron on September 28th. She stated that it was wonderful to fellowship with sisters in our neighboring counties. Nancy has been very busy!

Committee Reports

Beginning Teacher Support: Chair Mary Austell thanked everyone for the items brought to fill our new teacher bags. She reported 26 new teachers in the county this year. These bags will be assembled on November 18th at 10:00 a.m. and delivered to the teachers that day. She also reminded us about the THAT (Teachers Helping Another Teacher) form. Each member should record their volunteer hours and monetary support for beginning teachers on this form and submit it at our December meeting.

Membership Committee: In the absence of Chair Patricia Williamson, Melanie Burnette gave this report. The committee made motions to accept the resignations of Joyce Walker and Maggie Shupe. The motions carried. The committee also made motions to accept the requests for reserve status for Harriett Faulkner and Brenda Fuller. The motions carried. Melanie read an e-mail from Pat Riethmeier who is transferring her membership to Pi Chapter in St. Louis. No vote is necessary for a transfer. She will format it and put it online so that we can get to know each other better. It will also serve as your tribute when the time comes. Melanie reported that our membership has decreased this year due to a member's death and the resignation and/or transfer of members so we need to be vigilantly looking for new members. New Tech and Early College High Schools have no Gamma Chi members so our focus for new members should be there. Recommendations for new members may be submitted to the Membership Committee before February 1, 2014. There were forms available at the meeting or you may complete an interactive form by going to the International website, www.dkg.org. Members were reminded that they earn points toward their Member Excellence Award by recommending candidates for membership. Nancy added that it is very important to look for worthy candidates. DKG urges its chapters to have diversity in its membership.

Scholarship Committee: Chair Mary Ann Johnson reported that the Executive Board recommends that we make changes to the wording of the Professional Development Grant application. The Scholarship Committee made a motion that under the Information Section of the Professional Development Grant application where #1 now reads: "An award of up to \$250.00 will be given," we add the sentence, "Although a member may apply more than once, each member will be limited to a lifetime total of \$250.00 through this grant" and that we delete #4 that reads "This is a one-time grant opportunity." The motion carried. Edwina Rooker has asked for financial help in taking a creative writing course that critiques her writing. She has completed the application and requests \$65.00 for this class. Having received approval from the Finance Committee, the Scholarship Committee made a motion that we give Edwina Rooker a Professional Development Grant for \$65.00 to take this course. The motion carried. The Gamma Chi Scholarship and Grant-in-Aid forms have been updated and are also online with a deadline of February 1st. We will vote on the recipients at the March meeting, and they will be invited to the May meeting to receive their scholarship and/or grant-in-aid. Members should apply for the scholarship as well as the Eta State and International scholarships which are also due on February 1st. You do not have to be a doctoral student to apply for an International scholarship. The International form can be found on the DKG website and the State form can be found on the Eta State website. The Gamma Chi NBCT Grant and Professional Development Grant applications are online at our website. Members can apply for them at any time.

Communications and Publicity: In the absence of Chair Trina Paytner, Kristen Boyd reported that the *Eta State News* is transitioning from print to digital. The next issue, the Winter edition, will be digital and online the first week of November. The link will be sent to the chapter president who will send an e-mail to members telling them the copy is available and giving them the link to use. There will only be two more print editions, Spring 2014 and Spring 2015. They will be printed since they contain information about the upcoming state convention and the registration form. The advantages of the digital online version of *Eta State News* are being in color, more room to cover chapter news and saving the state printing and mailing costs. The Summer and Fall editions of the online versions of *Eta State News* with pages marked containing references to Gamma Chi were passed around. Our e-buddies will make a copy of the *Eta State News* and either send or mail it to our members who do not have e-mail. We have e-buddies for all of our non e-mail members except Edith Allen. Mary Brodie Raiford volunteered to be Edith's e-buddy. Yearbook Editor Nancy Tunstall will send each member an updated Member Directory after October 31st, the last day to pay dues, at which time the membership for this year will be finalized. Finally, members, especially committee chairs, were encouraged to submit articles to Nancy Tunstall for publication in the *Gamma Chi Newsletter*. The cutoff for the next edition is November 12.

Finance Committee: In the absence of Chair Debra Clayton, Treasurer Shirley White gave the finance report. As recommended by the Executive Board, the Finance Committee made a motion that we adopt the proposed budgets and recommended dues. The motion carried.

Spelling Bee Committee: Chair Ginny Bernard reported that the Warren Education Fund Spelling Bee will be held on May 17, 2014. She urged members to apply for WEF grants and urge their coworkers to apply. She also urged members to support the spelling bee by encouraging other groups to participate in the spelling bee.

Shirley White reported that she called or visited with reserve members Edith Allen, Mildred Johnson, Sue Skinner, Louise Twitty, Nell White, Melba Johnston (who attended tonight's meeting) and Jean White. She also called Wallace Brown.

No new or unfinished business was presented.

Lynn Meyers conducted our raffle. Nancy Tunstall thanked the Littleton group for their efforts. The meeting was adjourned.
