

I look forward to seeing you December 4th at the Norlina United Methodist Church.



SUE SKINNER REMEMBERED




The memorial service in memory of our beloved Gamma Chi sister, Sue Skinner, will be held at our May 7th meeting at St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

HAPPY 80th BIRTHDAY, ETA STATE!



Although Eta State held its birthday celebration at the state convention last April, Eta State didn't officially turned 80 until October 27, 2014. North Carolina was the seventh state to join DKG, and was named the 7th letter of the Greek alphabet, Eta (pronounced a-ta).

Here are some interesting facts about Eta State:

- October 27, 1934 Eta State was founded: by twelve recognized women leaders in education in North Carolina
- April 17, 1936 Alpha Chapter in Greensboro and Beta Chapter in Raleigh were chartered
- April 25, 1936 Gamma Chapter in Asheville followed closely
- May 4, 1937 The first convention was held in Greens-
- November 20, 1937 Delta Chapter was chartered in Greenville
- The first issue of the state Bulletin in 1941 reported eleven existing chapters
- By 1951 there were twenty-four chapters with a membership slightly over one thousand
- By 1955 Eta State was able to establish a regular scholarship program
- Eta State has grown to 104 chapters with over 4,500 members statewide.

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – OCTOBER 2, 2014

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Littleton United Methodist Church on Thursday, October 2, 2014. A Social Hour beginning at 6:00 p.m. was followed by an Initiation Ceremony, during which LaTrenda Hawkins was welcomed into the chapter.

Laura Kearney offered the blessing and dinner was served at 6:30 p.m., catered by Robert Harris.

Patricia Williamson introduced the speaker, Janie Miller, who presented a program on the Newspaper in Education Literacy Program. The chapter presented to her a donation to the literacy program in her honor.

Following a brief time for committee chairs to meet with their committee members, President Debra Clayton called the business session to order. Recording Secretary Mary Catherine Harris reported attendance of 44 members and one guest. The minutes of the May 1, 2014 meeting were approved as printed and distributed with the newsletter. Shirley White, treasurer, presented her report, which showed a checking balance of \$403.41 and a savings balance of \$3,563.91. The report was filed for audit.

Nancy Tunstall, immediate past president, read a note from State President Pat Taylor. Debra Clayton expressed appreciation for the privilege of serving as president for the biennium.

Members with August, September, and October birthdays were recognized, and Ann Kilian was revealed as the Mystery Member.

Nancy Tunstall reported on the Executive Board Meeting held on September 14, 2014. In addition to a review of Eta State initiatives, highlights of the meeting were selection of Shirley White as treasurer for the biennium and the decision to give special recognition to reserve member Edith Allen on her 55th anniversary of DKG membership.

During the President's Report, President Clayton asked members to consider making a pledge to the new Eta State Educational Foundation. Pledge cards would be received at the October and December meetings. She noted the state president's theme, "Teachers As Leaders," and encouraged members to share their leadership skills and to invite prospective members to the December meeting, at which the state president would be guest speaker.

The following committee reports were given:

- Awards Committee Noting that Edith Allen had been recognized for 55 years of membership, Janis Meek and her committee presented Milestone Awards to Mildred Johnson, 35 years; Ann Kilian, 30 years; Martha Overby, 25 years; Harriett Faulkner, 20 years; Norma Retzlaff, 20 years; Paige Lamberson, 15 years; Nancy Tunstall, 15 years; Diana Bobbitt, 10 years; Angela Vaughan, 10 years; Sharon West, 10 years; and Trina Paynter, 5 years. Member Excellence Awards were presented to Mary Austell, Harriet Banzet, Melanie Burnette, Loree Harris, Janis Meek, Mary Brodie Raiford, Nancy Tunstall, and Shirley White. Perfect Attendance Awards were given to Sylvia Alston, Mary Austell, Paula Aycock, Ginny Bernard, Brooke Comer, Sallye Duncan, Loree Harris, Danylu Hundley, Ann Kilian, Louise Mitchum, Mary Brodie Raiford, Diane Reavis, Nancy Tunstall, and Shirley White. The Awards Committee made a motion to nominate Mary Austell for the Golden Key Award. The motion was approved. The committee chair reminded members to be mindful of the Gamma Chi Excellent Member form and to work toward obtaining 150 points to qualify for the award.
- Beginning Teacher Support Committee Mary Austell expressed appreciation for support of the project and encouraged members to attend a meeting to stuff the bags on November 17 at the Emmanuel Episcopal Parish House. She encouraged members to record their volunteer time and expense on THAT forms.
- Membership Committee Nancy Tunstall reminded members to complete and submit their biographical sketches and encouraged them to bring prospective members to the December meeting. She announced that requests for reserve status had come from Mary Ann Johnson, Connie King, and Susan Lynch. These requests were granted by vote of the members. Nancy noted a new initiative, Annie Calling, which promotes communication with former members about re-joining Delta Kappa Gamma.
- Finance Committee Shirley White presented the budget, reflecting estimated receipts of \$5,830.00 and estimated expenses of \$5,982.00. She noted that the budget would be amended at the December meeting to accommodate transition from 54 to 53 active members and from 14 to 15 reserve members. The budget was adopted.
- Planning Committee Nancy Tunstall reviewed the 2014-2016 Gamma Chi Strategic Action Plan, including goals of encouraging attendance at meetings, honoring members, increasing membership, encouraging taking leadership roles, and preserving Gamma Chi history. The plan was approved. She expressed appreciation to Mary Catherine Harris for completing the history for the 2012-2014 biennium.
- Afghan Committee Danylu Hundley expressed thanks to Sylvia Alston's mother for again making an afghan to raffle for the Scholarship Fund. She encouraged members to get tickets.
- World Fellowship Committee Loree Harris asked members to bring donations to the December meeting.
