
Have a Happy Thanksgiving and I look forward to seeing you December 3, at the Norlina United Methodist Church.

Please be present for this wonderful, musical program!


MEMORIAL SERVICE

Through our Member Excellence program, you helped to make Gamma Chi a "Superior" Chapter in Eta State again last year. We achieved 520 points (only needed 500 points) on our Chapter Achievement Form last year.

The form has been modified this year with several activities added, but the points required to reach each level have also increased. Now to be labeled "Superior," a chapter must achieve 600+ points. "Excellent" requires 475+ points and "Distinctive" requires 350+ points. To see the new Chapter Achievement form for 2015-2016, you can go to our website at:

Right now it looks like we will be able to achieve 555 points which is enough to be recognized as an "Excellent" chapter for the 2015-2016 year. Some of the things that we can start working on that will help us reach the "Superior" level for the 2016-2017 award are:

- Submit applications for DKG and State Scholarships and/or Professional Development Grants,
- Have a net increase in membership during that year,
- Contribute to various DKG and State funds, and
- Recognize more individual members for excellence.

We need each member to consider the importance of keeping track of your DKG work on your 2015-16 Member Excellence Form. If you have misplaced your form, it can be found at http://deltakappagamma.org/NC-

Perhaps you have thought of this as just another way to seek personal recognition and that is something you are not interested in at this point in your career. But, keep in mind that this is also the way we earn recognition as a chapter, and that should be something we all care about. In 2014-15, we recognized seven members for excellence. Let's set a goal to double that number this year.

Another way to earn up to 25 points is to contribute to DKG International funds. If you wish to contribute to DKG International funds, remember that these contributions are tax-deductible. The International funds are the Educational Foundation Fund, Emergency Fund, Golden Gift Fund, International Speakers Fund and Scholarship Fund. Any amount would be appreciated.

WORLD FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

From Delta Kappa Gamma's initial award of \$2,500 in 1960. based on \$11,528 in contributions, the program has grown through the 2013–2014 academic year to impressive totals: 900 women in 120 countries have received awards totaling \$3,269,100 since 1960. Contributions totaled \$3,811,171.12 (through June 2014).

Contributions and bequests determine the number of World Fellowship Awards given each year by the committee.

Awards given for 2015-2016 are composed of 20 recipients from 19 different countries who received \$4,000 each to pursue post-graduate degrees from American or Canadian universities. Six talented women received \$1,000 extensions to previous awards for a total of \$86,000 to 25 women in 19 countries.

These impressive numbers tell the story, and Gamma Chi Sisters can continue to impact education worldwide. Please continue this story by giving generously at our December meeting. If you cannot attend, please send your suggested minimum of \$3 contribution to Shirley White. Our chapter goal is \$100, but our committee's goal is at



least \$125. Thank you in advance for your contribution and for continuing this story!

Breakout session applications are now being accepted. The four strands for topics will be Technology,



GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – OCTOBER 1, 2015

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Littleton United Methodist Church in Littleton on Thursday, October 1, 2015. A social hour began at 6:00 p.m.

President Debra Clayton recognized Betty Anne Shearin, who offered a blessing before the meal catered by Robert Harris.

Following the meal, Debra Clayton called the business session to order. Recording Secretary Mary Catherine Harris reported attendance of 27 members. The minutes of the May 7, 2015 meeting were approved.

Shirley White presented the treasurer's report, which showed a checking balance of \$699.84 and a savings balance of \$3,503.88. The report was filed for audit.

Corresponding Secretary Sallye Duncan reported that she had sent sympathy cards to the families of Jeffrey Evans and Melba Johnston. She also reported on the regrets from members who were unable to attend the meeting.

The president recognized members with birthdays in August, September, and October. She congratulated Norma Retzlaff on her retirement and revealed Mary Brodie Raiford to be the Mystery Member. Other recognitions included congratulations to Jamie Pernell on the birth of her baby and to Erin Simons on being named Teacher of the Year. Condolences were expressed to Nancy Tunstall on the death of her brother.

Mary Catherine Harris read the report of the August 2, 2015 executive board meeting. Upon recommendation of the executive board, the chapter voted to eliminate the NBCT Grant and raise the Professional Development Grant to \$500.
