

WORLD FELLOWSHIP TOUCHING HEARTS & MINDS: DKG AND ZIMBABWE



Malnutrition is one of the worst health problems in Zimbabwe and for years it has been the main concern of a woman leader, Guguletuh Moyo. DKG recognized her leadership efforts to create a better way to help children, not to wait until they are severely malnourished before providing them with nutritional assistance. Instead she wants to develop sustainable nutritional interventions that promote community ownership and use of local resources.

How has DKG recognized her efforts and given a helping hand to children from Zimbabwe? By giving Guguletuh a DKG world fellowship award that will help her to pursue her Ph.D. dream in nutrition in a U.S. university. With the knowledge and skills she is developing, she will fight against the lack of critical mass of Ph.D qualified nutrition scientists in Zimbabwe and forge ahead with her research findings.

Guguletuh told us: "I am thankful to Delta Kappa Gamma for covering a portion of my tuition. Without this support, I would not be here, working towards my dream of a research and teaching career."

At the same time, DKG can tell her, "We thank you for giving DKG the chance to touch your heart and your mind, to give a helping hand to the children of Zimbabwe, and to make us stronger and more devoted to the cause of educating women!"

DIANE COLIN IS AWARDED A NC DKG EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION GRANT

The North Carolina Delta Kappa Gamma Educational Foundation announced that Diane Colin has been awarded a Learning/Literacy Project Grant in the amount of \$1,000.00 to fund her Drumming Project.

The grant was written in order to purchase more tall drums for Vaughan Elementary School's Global Arts Program. Vaughan is a Global Elementary School with the only music program among Warren County Elementary Schools. The drums will help students explore music and rhythms of drumming circles in many cultures.

Drumming in the music classroom helps students communicate better with their fellow students and others by having learned how to listen to others, respect the need of others to have their own musical and personal space, how to lead and how to follow, as well as personal discipline and singing while playing as in the African tradition.

In addition, it is great for releasing extra tension and energy while fostering healing, wholeness and unity through music.

Students apply drumming techniques and rhythm reading while playing. They also learn to improvise or "jam" to recorded music, all while having fun!

Diane stated that she is so very happy to have her project recognized for its value to help Vaughan's students who are the beneficiaries of this wonderful gift. She is very appreciative of the Grants Review Committee for selecting her and her project.

The North Carolina Delta Kappa Gamma established the NC DKG Educational Foundation in 2015 after being awarded 501(c)(3) status by the IRS. Since then it has worked diligently to receive funds. Grants are awarded yearly for Continuing Education for Professional/Personal Growth and for the Advancement of Learning and/or Literacy in a Classroom, School, or Community Setting. Applications for the grants must be received by September 30.
