

Beth will be accompanied by her mother, Anne Briley, who is also a longtime DKG member and former state officer.





WORLD FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

World Fellowship provides monetary awards to women from around the world to study in the United States and Canada. Impressive numbers tell the story. From an initial award of \$2,500 in 1960, based on \$11,528 in contributions, the program has grown through the 2019-2020 academic year to impressive totals: Impacting education worldwide, 986 women in 122 countries have received awards totaling \$3,699,600 since 1960. Contributions total \$4,112,603.78 (through June 30, 2019). Awards given in 2019-2020 were: 19 \$4,000 awards, 7 \$500 extensions and 4 \$1000 extensions for a total of \$83,500 to 30 women in 21 countries.

DKG is impacting education worldwide through World Fellowship. Find the names and schools of the current scholars in the brochure on the link on the Brochures/Flyers page.

WORLD FELLOWSHIP



How often have you contributed to the World Fellowship Fund and wondered who would benefit from your donation? It is likely that many DKG members have asked the same question about the way World Fellowship funds are distributed, and this blog post should highlight the

details of this important program.

The theme of the World Fellowship Fund sounds like a very lofty goal, but there is truth in every word. "Impacting Education Worldwide" is exactly what the program provides in opportunities for women from all over the globe to further their educations.

In 1972, the World Fellowship Committee became a standing committee of the Society but has been in existence since 1960. Contributions and bequests to this fund determine the number of awards given each year. Your donations are critical to the ongoing work of World Fellowship.

All recipients are non-member women educators who reside in countries other than the United States or Canada. Delta Kappa Gamma receives applications from the Institute of International Education (IIE) in the United States. IIE screens the applicants and then helps students with enrollment, visas, insurance, and travel. Students wishing to attend Canadian universities submit their requests to members of the World Fellowship committees in Alberta, Ontario, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan. Evaluation and ranking are completed by the International World Fellowship Committee.

Contributing to World Fellowship can be considered your own personal mission work as you reach out beyond your local sphere of influence. After logging on to the Society website, you can click "Resources" on the black banner and then choose "Brochures and Flyers." You will find a blue tab that allows you to view the current World Fellowship recipients. Names, addresses, birthdates, and fields of study are available. Seeing the names of individuals who are currently reaping the benefits of funds donated to this cause will certainly change your perspective about giving money to World Fellowship.

Members of DKG have touched the lives of many students during their varied careers. With World Fellowship, there is a new opportunity to support women who have traveled many miles to fulfill their dreams of education in America and Canada. In addition to your monetary contributions, please consider choosing at least one current World Fellowship recipient to contact with words of encouragement. "Impacting Education Worldwide" will then become a true mantra for each of us

NC DKG Educational Foundation Day of Giving is Saturday, November 20


Again this year, the NC DKG Educational Foundation will sponsor *A Day of Giving*. They encourage every member to donate \$5 on this day.

The Foundation gave over \$10,000 in grants alone to educators last year, and has two grant cycles a year plus scholarships from endowments.

A **Day of Giving** celebrates the Educational Foundation, and is a day for members to show our DKG pride and gratitude for the work of the Foundation and its impact on chapters and members in NC.



EDUCATIONAL PROJECT AWARD



It is extremely likely that you or someone you know has had a fantastic idea for a project involving your chapter or state organization, but had trouble

obtaining the funding necessary to help the project succeed. The answer to all your problems may be found by applying for the Educational Project Award. The DKG International Educators Foundation provides monies which support projects designed to address intercultural understanding, encourage standards of excellence in education, or assist and cooperate with various funds in support of the improvement of education.

For 2020-2021, eleven (11) first-time projects were accepted and \$36,365.00 (USD) was awarded to various state organizations. Three projects totaling \$13,635.00 (USD) were renewed for the year. For more information, you can visit the DKG website. From the Home page, look to the far right of the black banner and click on DKGIEF before scrolling to Educational Projects. Tabs labeled Apply, Recipients, Mid-Year Form and Year-End Form will give you access to further information about the grant process. Click on Recipients to peruse the various projects which have been approved. You will surely be amazed to discover that you have had very similar ideas, but just didn't know where to turn for assistance in getting those projects off the ground.

The application process is simple. Obtain an application packet from July $\mathbf{1}-\mathbf{January}$ 3. Applications must be submitted electronically to Headquarters **by March 1** in order to be considered. Applications are available online. Any further

documents required are also easily accessible. If not completed after one year, your project is eligible for a one-time renewal.

Since the next deadline is March 1, 2022, don't hesitate to begin putting together the details of your great idea for a project. DKG may be able to assist you in seeing your dreams become a reality.

SALE OF INTERNATIONAL HEADQUARTERS IS COMPLETE



DKG has been involved in the process of selling the international headquarters building for the past two years. That process has been com-

pleted, and the sale

was final on September 1, 2021. The conversations surrounding next steps will now transition into action as the Administrative Board finalizes plans to move to a new site.

A meeting of the International Administrative Board was called in August to determine a plan for the transition to a new office space. The Board determined it would be in the Society's best interests to lease office space for the immediate future. Due to the dynamic nature of the Austin area real estate market, an ad hoc committee was appointed to approve potential lease options.

Members may inquire about how the proceeds from the sale will be managed or used. Because the building is considered a permanent asset, the proceeds from the sale of it were appropriately deposited into the Permanent Fund of the Society. The Constitution defines in Article IV how the monies in the Permanent Fund may be used and will be the guide for any future use of the sale proceeds.

A previously appointed ad hoc committee, consisting of board members, members, and staff, is working on a recommendation regarding archiving, preserving and keeping, moving, selling and/or disposing of the furnishings and other items in the building. The recommendation from that committee will be considered by the Board during its next meeting.

Under a lease agreement, the building will be occupied by DKG for six months after the sale. While the six months provides some time to consider all viable options, DKG leaders also realize that time will not allow them to move too slowly. And so, the journey to a new site continues forward with increasing momentum.

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 2, 2021

On September 2, 2021, the Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at the Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Warrenton for a blended meeting with members attending both in-person and through Zoom. Before the business meeting, an induction ceremony was held for three new members: Kirby Alston, Shannon Fuller, and Kathy Stewart. President Hall called the meeting to order. There was a quorum as thirty-one members and one guest were present.

Shirley White presented the treasurer's report. The financial audit found no issues. The fiscal year ended in June with a checking account income of \$10,659.92 and expenses of \$5,887.36 leaving a balance of \$4,772.56. In July the new fiscal year began. At the end of August, the checking account income was \$4,822.56 with expenses of \$664.75 leaving a balance of \$4,157.81. The fiscal year ended in June with a savings account income of \$7,546.52, expenses of \$3,000.00, and a balance of \$4,546.52. In July the new fiscal year began. At the end of August, the savings account income was \$4,546.76, expenses of \$0.00, and a balance of \$4,546.76. The report was received and filed for audit.

No report from the corresponding secretary.
