




## **GUEST SPEAKER FOR DECEMBER: OUR NEW REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR REGION III**

At our September meeting, we heard a presentation by Dr. Dutchess Maye, the owner and CEO of an education consulting firm. She inspires those who participate in her sessions to "Rock Your Day Every Day." Her vibrant personality entertained the members as she presented ideas on approaching emotional events in our lives.



Dr. Maye emphasized that we can make conscious, logical choices that enable us to rock the day rather than be rocked by the day, such as choosing joy over anger. Members received a mood and emotional ruler based on work of the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence's RULER Method. The acronym RULER stands for: R - Recognizing emotions in self and others, U -Understanding triggers and effects, L - Labeling emotions accurately, E - Expressing emotions aptly, and R - Regulating emotions effectively.

Dutchess expressed her thanks for allowing her to visit our chapter via an email. She stated, "Thanks for the invitation, a lovely meal, wonderful gifts, and a sisterhood that demonstrates not only excellence in DKG but also warmth, kindness, and a welcoming spirit. A World Fellowship recipient from Ukraine said that DKG support for women gives her a sense of empowerment because DKG members have encouraged her with their words and financial support. "I've been very touched by this endless support, and I honestly feel like they are helping me to mentally survive these dark times away from home."

A World Fellowship recipient from Kazakhstan said, "I hope to return to my country and apply my knowledge to make the lives of kids with special needs better. I am grateful to DKG for this life-changing opportunity."

The World Fellowship Fund, established in 1960, has provided awards totaling \$3,739,250 for 1,029 women from 122


countries to pursue graduate studies in Canada and the United States. Twenty-five women in 23 countries received awards in 2021-2022 totaling \$83,500.

#### Spring Convention Project Announced

The 2023 NC DKG Convention Project is collecting food and monetary funds for the Food Bank of the Albemarle located in



Elizabeth City. The Food Bank of the Albemarle helps fight hunger and poverty in northeast NC, serving Beaufort, Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Hertford, Hyde, Martin, Northampton, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Washington counties.

The Food Bank is collecting canned items such as meats, proteins, vegetables, fruits and soups, as well as dry goods such as pasta, cereal, rice and dried beans. In addition to food items, toiletries, personal hygiene items, toilet tissue, and laundry soap are very much needed to help families. These are necessary essentials that they cannot obtain with food stamp benefits.

## SCHOLARSHIPS—ONE OF THE BENEFITS OF DKG MEMBERSHIP



Did you know that as many as 30 scholarships are available for DKG members studying at the graduate level? Scholarships for

the master's degree level are \$6,000 and for the doctorate level \$10,000. DKG awarded 9 Doctoral Scholarships and 4 Graduate Studies Scholarships for a total of \$114,000 in 2022. Requirements for the doctoral level are three years of active membership and for other graduate levels, one year of active membership. Applicants should show evidence of community service and excellence in scholarship. Other requirements can be viewed at DKG International Educators Foundation.

To apply, a member should complete the <u>current application form</u> found on the DKG website, request appropriate transcripts, obtain status of program documentation, and secure letters of recommendation. She will then send the application and required materials as an e-mail attachment to Society Headquarters by *February 1*. Now is the time for members to begin preparing applications.

Not only are there scholarships offered at the international level, but NC DKG and Gamma Chi also offer them. DKG at all levels has made a difference to these recipients pursuing advanced degrees. This financial support also offers encouragement to the recipients who feel that someone is supporting their efforts to gain new knowledge and credentials.

The availability of scholarships can be used as a recruiting tool for new members. What an excellent opportunity to promote membership in DKG by sharing the scholarship opportunities for members! Our scholarships show that DKG really does offer meaningful support for women educators and opportunities for them. Members who already have advanced degrees also support other women educators with their DKG membership.

### **GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 1, 2022**

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, hosted by the Warrenton Group, met at Frontier Warren on September 1, 2022. President Dr. Sylvia Alston welcomed the members and one guest. Mary Catherine Harris offered thanksgiving for the meeting and the meal before the ladies enjoyed a delicious buffet meal consisting of a tossed salad, herbed chicken, steamed vegetable medley, creamy mashed potatoes, buttered crescent rolls, cheesecake, pineapple cake and sweet tea, catered by Hilda Cordell.
