



NC DKG President Jane "Janie" Webb, a member of Alpha Zeta (Region VIII), has been active in DKG since 2012, holding leadership roles within her chapter including secretary, vice president, and president. She served as Region VIII Director for NC DKG and was elected NC DKG Second Vice

President, overseeing regional directors. She was appointed as First Vice-President and notably presided over the 2024 Convention Birthday Brunch. Her involvement with NC DKG encompasses coordinating the convention workshop schedule, training new chapter leaders, and providing support for the 2025 NC DKG Leadership Development Seminar.

GAMMA CHI MEMBER AWARDED \$1,000.00



The Board of the NC DKG Educational Foundation has awarded Diane Colin the Maxine and Don McCall Endowment Grant for Gifted Education or Fine Arts for \$1,000.00. The title of her grant proposal was *Hear Me Strum!* The grant will be used to purchase twelve guitars for the new guitar program at Littleton Academy.

After surveying the rising 6th through 9th graders last spring, the overwhelming majority of students wanted to learn how to play guitar. In listing the purpose and rationale for the grant, Diane shared research on hands-on-learning through music education and how it supports all other subjects and skills. Social engagement is extremely high as students can learn basic strumming, picking, and notation and carry that with them wherever they go, literally, as a guitar is easily transported, and figuratively, as they won't forget how to play if they keep up with it. Many people play for themselves, offering joy and solace, while others "jam" in groups or take off professionally. There are

many future opportunities for scholarships if they choose to pursue music in college. Learning to play a guitar adds to the many wonderful learning opportunities at Littleton Academy that provide for a well-rounded student, one of Littleton Academy's many goals for their students.

As a music teacher, Diane provides many opportunities for her students' growth. Diane stated, "I love my students and they know they can trust me to learn and have fun!" Gamma Chi is very fortunate to have such a talented member!

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES - SEPTEMBER 4, 2025

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, hosted by the Warrenton Group, met at Warrenton Church of God Fellowship Hall on September 4, 2025. Members socialized and took care of various financial responsibilities prior to the tasty meal. Hilda Cordell and her team catered a dinner of tossed salad, fried chicken, pulled pork, green beans, rice pilaf, rolls, cheesecake, pineapple cake, and iced tea. Members gave her an appreciative round of applause for the delicious dinner.

Following dinner President Sheila Robertson introduced guest speaker Sharon Frazier who currently serves as chair of the NC DKG Educational Foundation Board. Frazier spoke enthusiastically about the growth of the foundation since its incorporation in 2014. She discussed different opportunities to apply for funds to support professional or personal growth, to enhance classroom activities, or to provide external or experiential learning for students. Not only can DKG members apply, but other educators may also apply. There are two application deadlines each year — September 30 and January 31. Information about these grants may be found on the NCDKGEF website at www.ncdkgef.org. Frazier encouraged members to support the foundation and to apply for all available grants by stated deadlines. After the remarks concluded, President Robertson presented Chair Sharon Frazier with a card stating that a donation will be made to the NC DKG Educational Foundation in her honor, a red rose, and a Gamma Chi tote bag in appreciation of her visit.

President Robertson called the meeting to order. Recording Secretary Evelyn Hall stated that the 30 members present constituted a quorum. The minutes of the May meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter. Treasurer Debra Clayton reported a checking account balance of \$3,812.15 and a savings account balance of \$4,942.44. The report was approved.

Corresponding Secretary Gail Coleman read a note of thanks from the Blankenship family for the card of sympathy sent during the loss of their family member, Lucy Menefee.

President Robertson recognized July, August, and September birthdays with a gift of a natural pink quartz stone heart to place in your pocket or purse to help charge your energy. She also announced that the Mystery Member is Danylu Hundley. President Robertson also recognized member Sara Council on her selection to serve on the NC DKG Educational Law and Policy Committee. Sara's selection was inadvertently omitted in the newsletter article about three other members serving on state committees.

Recording Secretary Evelyn Hall reported on the July 26 meeting of the Executive Board and Planning Committee. Actions taken were the approval of meeting dates and programs, approval of the proposed budgets for checking and savings, and approval of current projects at the same level of funding. The next Executive Board meeting will be held 30 minutes before the start of the December meeting.

Afghan Committee Chair Danylu Hundley joyously reported that \$108 has already been turned in for the afghan raffle.

Awards Committee Chair Dr. Sylvia Alston presented the annual awards as follows. Recognitions with pins and certificates for Member Excellence went to Dr. Sylvia Alston, Melanie Burnette, Betsy Clark, Debra Clayton, Gail Coleman, Diane Colin, Sara Council, Evelyn Hall, Loree Harris, Norma Retzlaff, Sheila Robertson, and Nancy Tunstall. The Awards Committee selected Evelyn Hall to receive the Golden Key Award and Sara Council to receive the Rising Star Award. A motion was made to choose these two to be our submitted nominees for the state awards of the same name to be presented at the 2026 NC DKG Convention next spring. The motion was enthusiastically approved. Photographs of all honorees present were taken. Dr. Alston encouraged members to fill out the Member Excellence checklist, beginning now for an award next fall. As an incentive, all members who have perfect attendance for our four meetings will be eligible for a drawing for a free meal at the September 2026 meeting.
