

Final payment - \$25.00 at the meeting on May 7th



OUR CHAPTER ACHIEVEMENT FORM

Since I was president when the NC DKG Chapter Achievement Form was first introduced, I've become very familiar with it. Its purpose is two-fold. First, it assists chapters in defining and collecting information about their status in accomplishing chapter activities and responsibilities such as

chapter representation at various events, chapter communications, community projects, chapter strategic plan, chapter attendance, scholarships and awards presented, and contributions to and support of international and state activities/projects. Secondly, it acknowledges, recognizes and appreciates those chapters who meet the criteria at various levels of achievement.

Currently there are four achievement levels: Honorable Mention below 350; Distinctive requires 350+ points; Excellent, 475+ points; and Superior, 600+ points. Additionally, the Presidential Chapter Achievement Award is given to up to five chapters who score at least at the superior level and earn the highest number of points. These awards are presented at the annual NC DKG Convention in May. Points are accumulated from March 1 to the next March 1 with the form being submitted by March 1 each year. Gamma Chi has achieved the Presidential Award in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017 and 2018. We barely missed it in 2016 due to increasing the points needed from 500 to 600. We got back on track in 2017 and 2018. We missed it in 2019 by five points! We definitely want it in 2020!!!

I am so proud of our chapter! We pulled together this year. **We have amassed the most points ever—730 points!** This is an increase of 70 points over last year. If you see this label, use the new Box Tops app to scan your receipt. **Box Tops are still worth 10¢ each for your school.** The app will find participating products purchased at any store and instantly add cash to your school's earnings online. CONVENTION PROJECT ANNOUNCED: NC DKG HEADQUARTERS FUND



Region VII has decided to take a departure from supporting the needs of others as it has in recent years. The convention project is

designed to help our Society by supporting the NC DKG Headquarters. Headquarters receives all of its funding through contributions. Headquarters, dedicated in 1999, had to have the well and pump replaced last year. The house is an older structure and needs routine and unexpected maintenance. The annual budget may not account for all the needs, so Headquarters makes a good convention project.

The facility is important to NC DKG. It provides a centrally located place for state and chapter meetings and activities. Important records are stored there. NC DKG's charter hangs on Headquarters' wall, alongside pencil etches of all state past presidents and a beautiful handmade quilt depicting each chapter in NC.

At our March meeting, please bring your contribution for headquarters. Financial gifts may be made as memorials or in honor of someone. Checks (made out to NC DKG and designated for Headquarters Fund), as well as cash, will be collected. Thank you in advance for your contribution.



Schools for Africa became the Society's first official international project in 2010. Members have donated, as of October 2016, over \$324,150 to the project. Currently the project **benefits 5 million children** in 13 countries in sub-Saharan Africa including Angola, Malawi, Mozambique, Rwanda, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Niger, Burkina Faso, Mali, Ethiopia, Madagascar, Sierra Leone and Guinea Bissau. The SFA mission involves providing access to quality basic education for children, focusing on girls, orphans and other vulnerable youngsters. UNICEF works through this project with governments, local authorities, communities and other partners.

Schools for Africa is building and rehabilitating nearly 1,000 schools, training almost 100,000 teachers, providing school supplies, and ensuring that schools have safe drinking water, as well as separate bathrooms for boys and girls.

The March meeting is our annual designated meeting to collect monies for this worthy project. **You can make a difference!** Please donate generously to help transform families, communities—and perhaps countries. GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – DECEMBER 5, 2019

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Norlina United Methodist Church on December 5th, 2019, beginning with a social hour at 5:45 p.m. There were 28 members, 1 prospective new member, and 2 guests present. Dr. Teresa Cowan presented the program for the meeting. Evelyn Hall presented Teresa and her husband (whose birthday was tonight) with donations to the NC DKG Educational Foundation, a poinsettia, and gold Gamma Chi bags. After the presentation, President Evelyn Hall convened the meeting. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written.

Shirley White presented the treasurer's report. The checkbook balance was \$2,957.21. The savings account balance was \$3,811.71. The report was received to be filed for audit.

Nancy Tunstall presented for Corresponding Secretary Aimee Anderson. We received 12 regrets from members not attending. Nancy Tunstall sent the chapter two thank-you cards, one for honoring her with a contribution for NC DKG Headquarters and the other for contributions made to the Gamma Chi Scholarship Fund in memory of her husband. Brenda Fuller sent a thank you card for the meal provided when her husband died. The following cards were sent from the chapter to members Lou Ann Bender for the passing of her mother and Vivien Windley who had knee surgery.

President Hall recognized members with birthdays in October, November, and December. Sheila Robertson was the mystery member listed in the newsletter. President Hall mentioned the beautiful design of the December newsletter and thanked Nancy Tunstall, the editor. Diane Colin was recognized for receiving two grants for her drumming project at Vaughan Elementary School.

Danylu Hundley spoke for the Awards Committee. The Gamma Chi Rising Star Award was presented to Jenny O'Meara. Jenny will be the chapter's nominee for the NC DKG Rising Star Award given out at the state convention. A member excellence award and milestone award (10 years) was presented to Loree Harris and Trina Paynter respectively.

Norma Retzlaff spoke for the Beginning Teacher Support Committee. The chapter helped support a welcome meal for new teachers to the county along with the Blankenship family. More than 20 people were able to attend the welcome meal, including new teachers, a new principal, two central office representatives, Gamma Chi members, and the Blankenship family. Gamma Chi presented 30 new teachers with new teacher bags during the week of November 18th (American Education Week).

Betsy Clark spoke for the Educational Excellence Committee. Betsy asked members to turn in their T.H.A.T. (teachers helping another teacher) forms.

Mary Austell spoke for the Membership Committee. She asked members to turn in their biographies. She reminded members to fill out prospect cards for potential new members. Prospective members can be presented for membership at any meeting. Kathy Stewart, a retired fourth grade teacher from Pennsylvania, was presented at tonight's meeting. President Hall called for the vote on Kathy's membership. The motion carried, and Kathy will become a member of Delta Kappa Gamma as soon as she attends an orientation session and pays her dues. President Hall reiterated the request of the Membership Committee for updating and creating bios and recommending new members.

Ashley Barnette presented for the Nominations Committee. Her committee will present a slate of officers for the 2020-2022 biennium at the March meeting.
