

SUCCESSFUL PODCAST!

The introduction tells the story of a raging fire ravaging a forest. All the animals fled to the edge of a stream feeling powerless to do anything except for one small hummingbird who plunged into

the stream and scooped as much water as it could into it beak. It flew back to the fire to spray water on it—going back and forth again and again. The other animals watched in disbelief and awe. They told the hummingbird that it was too small and its wings would catch fire. Never ceasing its efforts, the hummingbird told them, "I'm doing what I can. I'm doing something."

The following explanation of the podcasts is taken from the website: "Children deserve great childhoods. This is a story of those who believe the same. We explore how schools and communities work together to create transformative experiences with young people, work to bend the system, and chase the question: What will it take for every child in North Carolina to not only have a sound basic education, but to have catalytic experiences that drive them to step boldly into the futures they deserve and create a better world?

Two principals, Donnell Cannon and Jenny O'Meara, interview school designers, community organizers, learning engineers, and education activists to learn what we should be thinking about when it comes to reimagining the future and the steps we can take today to create better schools, better childhoods, and better people tomorrow."

The Golden Key and Rising Star are annual awards, but the Founders Award is only given in odd years. Our own Nancy Tunstall (2012), Shirley White (2014), Mary Austell (2017) and Mary Catherine Harris (2020) are recipients of the Golden Key Award. Debra Clayton (2016), Ashley Barnette (2017) and Evelyn Hall (2019) received the Rising Star Award. And last, but not least, Dr. Janis Meek received the prestigious Founders Award in 2017. We would like to see some of our members once again receive these awards at the convention.

NC DKG appreciates the time, the talent, and the dedication of those who work to improve the lives of students and women through educational excellence, leadership opportunities, and community service. The state organization will celebrate the contributions of some of these outstanding women at the 2021 convention in Asheville.

The Founders Award recognizes a NC woman who has made outstanding contributions to the improvement of human life through education, research, and/or service. She may or may not be a member of DKG but her actions are far reaching and support our vision.



The Golden Key Award honors members who have made significant contributions to DKG at the chapter

level, often behind the scenes without glory or personal gain.

The Rising Star Award will be given to women in their early years of DKG membership, seven years or less. These members demonstrate strong potential for successful leadership at the chapter and state levels and beyond.





Also at the upcoming meeting, our committee will be recognizing milestone members with service ranging from five to fifty years! Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and disruption of our meetings, we will not be recog-

nizing perfect attendance or member excellence awards. Hopefully, we can resume these awards for the 2021-2022 year starting next July 1.

Planning Process and Measurement

The Planning Committee will develop, review and monitor the plan. At the end of the biennium, the Planning Committee will determine all actions to be either **accomplished**, **in progress**, **incomplete** or **deleted**. Actions planned for and completed are reported **accomplished**. Those initiated but not fully implemented are reported **in progress**. Actions that require more time or a new direction are reported **incomplete**. Discontinued actions will be reported **deleted**.

Goals:

1. To encourage our members to actively attend meetings

- Action 1.1: Continue to promote the Gamma Chi Member Excellence Award. (Awards Committee)
- Action 1.2: Provide interesting and informative programs. (Planning Committee and EEC)
- **Action 1.3:** At each meeting, continue to recognize the birthdays of members for that meeting. (President)
- **Action 1.**4: Recognize members who have perfect attendance at all four meetings each year. (Awards Committee)
- **Action 1.5** Continue working on time management at meetings. (President)
- Action 1.6. Provide mentoring of new member. (Experienced members)

2. To honor our members

- **Action 2.1:** Continue to recognize members who have been members for multiples of five years. (Awards Committee)
- **Action 2.2:** Continue to write biographical sketches suitable for use as tributes for each member. (Membership Committee)
- **Action 2.**3: Recognize members who have perfect attendance at all four meetings each year. (Awards Committee)

3. To increase membership

- **Action 3.1:** Encourage selection of diverse candidates for membership; for example consider age, ethnicity, variety of careers/education work, etc. (Membership Committee)
- **Action 3.2:** Promote the benefits of membership: networking, scholarships for graduate study, professional development grants, spiritual fellowship, professional opportunities and leadership development. (Membership Committee, Scholarship Committee)
- Action 3.3: Seek members for reinstatement by contacting former members. (Membership Committee)
- **Action 3.4:** Encourage members to discuss membership responsibilities with prospective members prior to nominating them. (Membership Committee) (Members may invite a prospective member to be their guest at a meeting at the member's expense.)

4. To encourage members to assume leadership roles

- **Action 4.1:** Solicit younger members to attend the Leadership Development Seminar to be held in odd-numbered years. (President)
- **Action 4.2:** Provide financial assistance for those attending the Leadership Development Seminar. (Scholarship Committee—Gamma Chi Professional Development Grant)
- **Action 4.3:** Encourage committee chairs to mentor and train younger committee members to move up to a leadership position. (Committee chairs)
- **Action 4.**4: Encourage members to attend the NC DKG Convention, DKG International Convention and Regional Conferences. (President and Communications and Marketing Committee)

5. To preserve the rich history of the Gamma Chi Chapter

- **Action 5.1:** Continue to make electronic copies of minutes, newsletters and any other important documents. (Communications and Marketing Committee)
- **Action 5.2:** Continue to write a brief history of each biennium. (Historian)
- **Action 5.3:** Continue to keep a scrapbook of newspaper articles, chapter certificates and anything else of relevance to members' and/or the chapter's accomplishments. (Historian)
- **Action 5.4:** Maintain a historical record of scholarship and grant-in-aid recipients, amount given and the date of the award. (Scholarship Committee, Historian)
- **Action 5.5:** Consolidate storage of archived materials, determine if any of these materials may be discarded and maintain a list of the items. (President and Executive Board)
