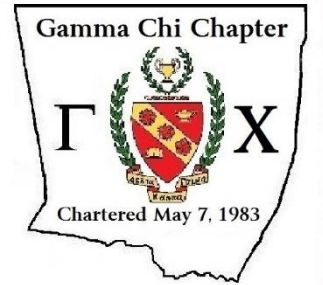



#### GAMMA CHI REPRESENTED AT THE CONVENTION



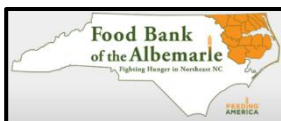
Entertainment for Saturday, April 29, at the NC DKG Convention will be students from the Littleton Academy Drum Circle in Littleton.

The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International (DKG) adopted Schools for Africa as our first official international project in 2010. Schools for Africa

(SFA) is a partnership between UNICEF, the Nelson Mandela Foundation, and Peter Krämer Stiftung. Schools for Africa helps the most disadvantaged children in Africa to get a quality education, focusing on girls, orphans, and other vulnerable youngsters. Currently the project works with 21 countries in sub-Saharan Africa. Schools for Africa has reached more than 30 million children.

With support from the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International and others, the SFA Program is achieving the following results:

- Reaching over 30 million children
- Improving access to quality basic education through inclusive and healthy schools; gender-sensitive education; qualified teacher and child-centered pedagogy; and safe schools.
- Promoting greater involvement of communities in children's early learning and well-being through parental education.
- Increasing access to and quality of informal learning programs and education for children in emergencies.
- Using an equity strategy to increase education rates for girls, rural and urban poor, ethnic minorities and children with disabilities.

## GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES – DECEMBER 1, 2022

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, hosted by the Norlina Group, met at the Norlina United Methodist Church on December 1, 2022. As members assembled, they viewed a slide show of the DKG International Convention, which President Alston attended in New Orleans in the summer. Members mingled as they donated books for area pre-schools and day care sites, contributed to the World Fellowship project, made donations to Gamma Chi's Scholarship fund, and purchased raffle tickets.

Dr. Sylvia Alston welcomed members and one guest.

The ladies enjoyed a meal of roast beef, baked chicken, potato casserole, string beans, butter beans, candied carrots, deviled eggs, rolls, and assorted pies and beverages. Norlina United Methodist Church Circle 4 prepared and served the delicious meal. The membership applauded their efforts.

President Dr. Sylvia Alston introduced the guest speaker, Tiffany Long, director of NC DKG Region III. Tiffany is a member of Wake County's Gamma Eta Chapter and is employed by Johnston County Schools as Assistant Principal at Smithfield-Selma High School. She left the classroom two years ago after acceptance into NC Principal Fellows Consortium 26. She encouraged the membership to network and lean on each other, to take time to breathe, and to be kind to self. Tiffany presented an abbreviated version of Eric Cork's "Alphabet of Education" using the letters of Gamma: G – Go the extra mile for kids; A – Act to make a difference; and M – Make the most of each day, which is a blessing. The chapter honored her with a \$50.00 contribution to NC DKG Educational Foundation, a poinsettia, and handmade gifts for her baby, who is due in January.

The president called the meeting to order. Betsy Clark, recording secretary, reported that 23 active members were in attendance, constituting a quorum. Minutes of the September 1, 2022, meeting were approved as printed in the chapter newsletter. Treasurer Shirley White presented her report with the checking account balance of \$4,798.55 on December 1, 2022. The savings account balance totaled \$3,417.71. The report was approved.

Nancy Tunstall, substituting for Corresponding Secretary Evelyn Hall, reported cards sent to Erin Riggan (birth of twins), Donna Liles and Sallye Duncan (births of grandchildren), Norma Retzlaff (illness), Janis Meek and Michele Stallings (deaths of family members), Lou Ann Bender (50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary), Nancy Tunstall (inclusion of photographs in the Fall DKG Art Gallery), and Sallye Duncan (recognition of daughter as Trailblazer). Nancy read a letter from Richard Blankenship, dated November 25, 2022, honoring his and Catherine's mother on her 100<sup>th</sup> birthdate. He included the family's annual \$2,000 memoriam for the chapter's scholarship funds.

Member recognitions by the president included October, November, and December birthdays, with each receiving a handmade dish cloth. She identified the Mystery Member as Laura Kearney, and the group applauded Shirley White for her 63<sup>rd</sup> wedding anniversary.

In her president's report, Dr. Alston encouraged members to be more aware of the opportunities afforded by the NC DKG Education Foundation. She emphasized the wide range of grant opportunities, including funds for cook book projects, weather stations, professional development, funding for graduate studies, tickets for students to attend cultural events, music instruments, and books for students to take home and keep.

President Alston called for committee reports.

**Beginning Teacher Support:** Gail Coleman on behalf of Norma Retzlaff reported that the chapter prepared and delivered 35 gift bags to new teachers in the Warren County system during American Education Week and that there are supplies to fill bags as more new employees are hired.

**Membership:** Aimee Cooper encouraged members to invite female educators in various fields to our next meeting, echoing a sentiment of President Alston. Alston presented Sara Council as a new member prospect. The membership voted to accept the recommendation. A date for Sara to meet for induction procedures will be scheduled.

**Scholarship:** Betsy Clark reported that at least two of the current grant-in-aid recipients will reapply for 2023. There is possibility of a third for graduate school. One Warren Early College senior plans to apply. All public schools in Warren County and Vance County have information through the guidance offices. She reminded members that there are scholarship and professional development funds available for them.

**World Fellowship:** Loree Harris passed the basket to increase the donations to this very worthy project of Gamma Chi. The total collected was \$140.00.

**Raffle:** Danylu Hundley reported that distributed tickets were \$50.00 short of the goal. Loree Harris covered the deficit.

There was no unfinished business.

When President Alston called for new business, Nancy Tunstall encouraged members to attend the 2023 NC DKG State Convention in Greenville on April 28-30, 2023. A motion was made, seconded and approved that Gamma Chi Professional Development Grants be used to cover the registration, hotel and travel expenses of attendees. She and Shirley gave instructions for registering. Nancy also encouraged members to present sessions at the convention. The deadline for applying is February 15. There is a link in the state newsletter. Members should consider the NC DKG Leadership Seminar on March 23-26, 2023. Find a link in state publications. The seminar is limited to 30 participants, first come, first served.

The Norlina Group held the raffle with numerous winners of bountiful gift bags.

President Alston adjourned the meeting.
