

Leading women educators impacting education worldwide will experience this international

conference with an arts and humanities theme. Potential topics include: storytelling, music, books and writing.

Because the conference hotel is located outside the city and has only one small restaurant, all conference meals are available for purchase on the registration form. Three of the meals are general sessions with speakers: Friday lunch, Saturday breakfast and Saturday dinner.

Hotel reservations are available online. Four Pre-Conference Tours will be held on Wednesday, June 26, 2019. One will be to the Biltmore Estate; another to the River Arts District of Asheville; another will tour the Blue Ridge Parkway with various stops along the way; and the last tour will be to the Omni Grove Park Inn, a famous hotel in Asheville. 

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – MARCH 7, 2019

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Littleton Baptist Church on Thursday, March 7, 2019, beginning with a social time at 5:45 p.m. President Evelyn Hall convened the meeting, with attendance of 28 members and no guests.

Mary Catherine Harris offered a blessing for the meal, catered by Robert Harris.

President Hall called the meeting to order.

The business session opened with approval of the minutes of the December meeting. Treasurer Shirley White presented the Treasurer's Report, noting a checking balance of \$2,390.59 and a savings balance of \$6,443.63. The report was accepted and filed. She noted we have received \$388 dollars for the scholarship fund and we need that number to reach \$500. The Blankenship Family gave \$2,000 for scholarships. Shirley also shared that there has been a change as to when dues are to be paid, as dues are now due June 30th of each year. Members should bring their \$85 dues to the May meeting.

Correspondence report included: get well cards to Janice Meek, Josephine Myrick, and Diana Bobbitt; sympathy card to Loree Harris; and congratulations card to Katrinka Brewer for being named Principal of the Year for WCS. Nancy Tunstall sent letters to state legislators urging them to consider legislation to improve education in North Carolina. Danylu Hundley, who was unable to attend, sent her thanks for the chapter donating 52 children's books at the December meeting fir the Reach Out and Read program. It was mentioned that *The Warren Record* had done a feature story about the note cards that Danylu has created from her mother's drawings. Her mother, Elizabeth Palmer, was a charter member.

Evelyn Hall gave the President's Report which included: recognizing February, March, and April birthdays and Vivian Windley as the Mystery Member. Evelyn announced that she had completed the Annual President's Report for the chapter. The Necrology Report indicated we did not lose any members in 2018. The Chapter Achievement Form was completed with much assistance from Nancy Tunstall. The chapter has reached the Superior level with 660 points, and it is hoped that the chapter will reach the Presidential level again this year. Mary Catherine Harris has been nominated for the Golden Key Award. Evelyn Hall has been nominated for the Rising Star Award. The Communication Excellence form was completed and turned in. The Eta State NC Convention will be in Hickory, NC, May 3rd through 5th. Jenny O'Meara and Nancy Tunstall will be presenting workshops at the Convention. The Convention will be collecting funds to assist members and their schools impacted by Hurricane Florence. They especially want cash and gift cards. The International Conference: Arts and Humanities is at the end of June in Asheville, and Evelyn Hall, Shirley White and Nancy Tunstall are planning to attend.

Reports of committees were as follows:

Educational Excellence Committee Chair Betsy Clark presented with an explanation of the support DKG provides to the Schools for Africa project through UNICEF. Also, the Educational Law and Policy Committee is encouraging members to speak to their legislators in Raleigh on April 10th.

Betsy Clark, Scholarship Committee chair, presented the following candidates to receive grants: Mila Alston, Ellen Denning, Faith Nickole Heisler, Zianne Richardson and Hailey Stroud. A motion was made by the committee to award all candidates with a grant and for Mila Alston to receive her grant in place of the scholarship normally given to a member since she is attending graduate school. Motion came from a committee, so no second was needed. The motion carried. Jenny O'Meara was approved for a professional development grant.

Mary Austell, Membership Committee chair, informed members that the election of new members will now occur in May with initiation at our September meeting. We are still working to encourage Xi Chapter members to reinstate.

Sylvia Alston presented for the Afghan Committee. She collected 21 tickets at this meeting. Tickets are still being sold in an effort to reach the yearly goal of \$500. Money goes to scholarships and grants-in-aid.

Awards Chair Sylvia Alston presented Chris Skinner and Kay Beaver with membership awards for 15 and 25 years respectively.

There were no other committee reports.

Reports on Reserve/Sick Members: Shirley White sent Christmas and Valentine's cards to reserve members. There were no other reports on reserve/sick members. Evelyn Hall did ask for prayers for a local family who lost their daughter in a plane crash.

In unfinished business, the spring cookout for new teachers at the Blankenship lake house was discussed. It will occur April 28th at 4 p.m. There was conversation about the importance of opening up to more than first year teachers so that more will attend. It was decided to invite first and second year teachers since last year the date

interfered with a scheduled Teach for America event. We may need to plan for some carpooling. We will send out individual invitations instead of just fliers. Gamma Chi members are asked to bring desserts. Sheila Robertson and Janis Meek are working on our chapter's centerpiece for the International Conference. The centerpieces will be raffled off for funding of the Eta State NC.

In new business, Nancy Tunstall made a motion that the chapter approve a professional development grant for Evelyn Hall to attend the International Conference. Sylvia Alston seconded. Motion carried. Nancy Tunstall made a motion that Gamma Chi place a \$25 ad in the International Conference program book. Sylvia Alston seconded. Motion carried.

Presentation at this meeting was postponed because of the lateness of the hour and technical difficulties.

The Littleton Group conducted the raffle.

The meeting adjourned at 8:03 p.m.

Descriptions of International Funds:

Educational Foundation Fund – any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support, encouragement and improvement of education. Also Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals and for seminars.

Emergency Fund – members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

Golden Gift Fund – provides for a member to attend a two-week leadership/management training seminar held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas at Austin in even numbered years.

International Speakers Fund – the purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our Eta State NC Convention each spring.

Scholarship Fund – members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies).
