

### PAYING TRIBUTE TO HARRIETT FAULKNER AND NELL WHITE

At our May meeting we will pay tribute to two of our Gamma Chi sisters. This event was planned for our May meeting in 2020 when we have traditionally remembered our sisters who have passed away since the previous May meeting. However, COVID disrupted that schedule. Now we will at long last be able to honor and remember these two sisters.

Harriett Evelyn Myers Faulkner passed away on January 24, 2020. Harriett had a variety of careers, but her love of children and helping them learn, plus encouragement from her son's principal, led her to return to school, receive her degree and begin her career as a teacher. She was loved and respected for her



dedication to teaching. She was honored by being selected as Teacher of the Year while she was at Northside Elementary School. She became a member of Gamma Chi Chapter of DKG on October 6, 1994. She held the offices of first vice-president and president, and she chaired and served on various committees. She was a member of DKG for over 25 years.

Nellie Frances Jarvis White passed away on May 18, 2019. Nell was a longtime music and English teacher. She became a



member of Xi Chapter of DKG on October 14, 1980 and was a charter member of Gamma Chi. She was a member of DKG for over 38 years. Nell was 91 when she died. She was a remarkable, talented woman, and a very active member for many years.

## DKG AND FACEBOOK— WHAT EVERYONE NEEDS TO KNOW!



Delta Kappa Gamma is fortunate to have an official Facebook business page and numerous Facebook group pages. Knowing what each type provides and entails can reduce

the confusion members and others experience when searching for DKG on Facebook.

The following information describes the features and differences between two DKG Facebook pages: The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Facebook business page and the

Delta Kappa Gamma Society International public group page. These pages serve different purposes and fill different needs for members; they complement each other.

The Delta Kappa Gamma Society Facebook business page with the red rose logo establishes the official, professional presence for DKG, including its address, phone number, business hours, and other business-related information. The Facebook administrators of this DKG business page are the staff at DKG Headquarters in Austin, Texas, who are responsible for posting all content and for ensuring that the legal business entity known as The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International is represented with oversight from the DKG International President.

- People, including members, follow the business page by "liking" the page. Once members have "liked" the DKG business page, the DKG posts will show up on the members' Facebook news feeds.
- The business page is used to make announcements, share updates and relevant news, and connect members to other DKG communication vehicles such as blogs, publications, and others. Events and opportunities sponsored by DKG International are announced here: official conferences, conventions, webinars, scholarships, deadline dates, and more.
- All kinds of audiences can interact on and with this page

   whether they are members, potential members, or
   other audiences just browsing. Members and others can
   connect and engage by commenting on the posts.
- However, because they do not represent the official business entity, individuals in such audiences may not initiate posts or upload files, pictures, and documents.

The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Facebook public group page, a page often confused with the official business page, was initiated in 2009 and boasts a membership of 3,300. This group page provides a place for DKG members to share news on individuals, chapters, state organizations, and international events. This public group page is member-driven and monitored by five DKG members acting as administrators. This public group of DKG members creates its own content for this group page. Members on this page represent themselves in their posts. Because they do not represent the official Society, they do not require permission to post and share on this site. Likewise, individuals, chapters, state organizations, and outside organizations do not require permission from the legal entity known as DKG International or the International President to promote and host events, webinars, and meetings; members do so at their own direction.

- On this page, members may post and share posts from other public and business pages. For example, members can share the announcements that appear on the DKG Society International business page. From here, DKG members are able to "share" with other DKG members on public pages—including the many state organizations and chapter pages that are focused on the interests of those groups.
- Members can upload and download files, brochures, pictures, and documents to share with each other on this page. Members can tag other members.

- Members can invite members on the public page to meetings, lectures, webinars, and other opportunities hosted by individual members, chapters, and state organizations.
- Any member can also invite another member to join the page. A member requesting directly to join must answer questions on location and status of her membership.
- Members can help group members find resources, information, or other items as well as connect members with each other. The public group page allows members to explore new projects or ideas.

As a member, you can engage with others by visiting and clicking "like" on the DKG International Facebook business page and by joining the DKG international Facebook group page and other smaller group pages. Learning about these DKG Facebook page types is an important step that could result in a stronger DKG experience.

### **GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – MARCH 3, 2022**

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at the Littleton Baptist Church on March 3, 2022 beginning with a social hour at 6:00 p.m. followed by a meal prepared by the Littleton group. President Evelyn Hall welcomed new member Rachel Smith. There were 24 members present. Evelyn Hall gave a presentation entitled "Exploring the Services Offered by the Warren County Memorial Library." First Vice President Betsy Clark presented Evelyn with a long stemmed red rose and a card stating that a donation would be made to the Warren County Memorial Library in her honor.

After the program, President Hall convened the meeting. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written.

Shirley White expressed her awe and surprise at the celebration of her 50+ years of DKG at the December meeting and thanked everyone again. She then presented the treasurer's report. The checkbook balance was \$3,973.69. The savings account balance was \$8,416.70. The report was received to be filed for audit.

Correspondence included thank you notes from the Burrows family, NC DKG Educational Foundation and DKG International. Also, NC DKG President Beth Winstead expressed her gratitude for the hospitality extended to her and her mother when she visited our chapter at the December meeting.

President Hall recognized members with birthdays from January through March. They received an air plant. The mystery member from the newsletter was identified as Crystal Brantley.

President Hall stated that the Chapter President 2021 Annual Report, the Chapter Achievement form, the Golden Key and Rising Star Award nomination forms and the Communication Excellence form had all been submitted. Enough points were scored on the Chapter Achievement form to qualify our chapter for the Superior Achievement level. Members were encouraged to contribute to the NC DKG Convention Project, MANNA FoodBank, and to attend the convention.

Educational Excellence Committee Chair Betsy Clark gave a presentation on the International Project, Schools for Africa. She gave facts on how the Schools for Africa Project was helping education in Uganda and South Africa by building/improving schools, providing safe water and sanitary facilities, training teachers and providing school supplies. She passed around a basket for donations for SFA.

Membership Committee Chair Aimee Cooper read requests from Dr. Janis Meek and Martha Ann Overby requesting reserve status. She made motions for each of them from the Membership Committee that their requests be approved. The motions passed. She then stated that the Executive Board had recommended that we grant honorary membership to Josephine Myrick in recognition of all the service she had rendered to the Scholarship Fund in making afghans to raffle. Aimee made the motion from the Membership Committee that we grant Josephine Myrick honorary membership. The motion passed. She will be inducted at the May meeting along with new member Rachel Smith.

In the absence of Nominations Committee Chair Ashley Barnette, Nancy Tunstall presented the 2022-2024 slate of officers for Gamma Chi and made a motion that we elect the following slate of officers: Dr. Sylvia Alston for president, Sheila Robertson for first vice president, Aimee Cooper for second vice president, Betsy Clark for recording secretary and Evelyn Hall for corresponding secretary. The motion passed.

Scholarship Committee Chair Betsy Clark stated that grants-in-aid recipients Mila Alston and Ellen Denning were completing their degrees. No high school students applied for a grant-in-aid. She made a motion from the committee that we renew the grants-in-aid for Faith Nicole Heisler, Robin West Edwards, Heidy Labra-Franco and Hailey Stroud. The motion passed.

Afghan Committee Chair Danylu Hundley stated that as of this meeting, we had already reached our goal of \$500. This is the first time that has happened by the third meeting during the ten years that we have been raffling an afghan.

Under new business, President Hall asked members to be thinking about what committee they would like to serve on for the upcoming biennium. Nancy Tunstall will be preparing a SignUpGenius for the committee list. After discussion of the NC DKG Convention to be held in Asheville April 29-May 1, Nancy Tunstall made a motion that we use Gamma Chi Professional Development grants to pay the registration and expenses of the members who turn in their registration invoices to our treasurer, Shirley White, for the NC DKG Convention. Sylvia Alston seconded the motion. The motion passed.

President Hall mentioned that the DKG International Convention would be held in New Orleans from July 12-16. We have a room reserved and would like for some of our members to attend.

At the May meeting, a memorial service will be held for Harriett Faulkner and Nell White. The original service was planned for May 2020, but was cancelled due to COVID. Discussion was held about who would give the tributes and who should be invited.

President Hall adjourned the meeting and the Littleton Group conducted the raffle.

### **Descriptions of DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) Funds:**

**Cornetet Award** —Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals (applications due November 1 & May 1) and for educational seminars (applications due November 1).

Educational Projects – Any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support encouragement and improvement of education. (Applications due March 1)

Educators Award – Selected women authors receive cash awards for non-fiction writing impacting education.


**Emergency Fund** – Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

**ETH Leadership** – Supports superb speakers for international meetings and other leadership events.

**Golden Gift Fund** – Provides for a member to attend a two-week leadership/management training seminar held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas at Austin in even numbered years.

International Speakers Fund – The purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our NC DKG Convention each spring. (Applications due September 15.)

Scholarship Fund – Members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies). (Applications due February 1.)
