In March 2014, the state of North Carolina approved Articles of Incorporation for the NC DKG Educational Foundation and on January 28, 2015, the Foundation was awarded 501(c)(3) status by the IRS. For ten years it has operated as a nonprofit organization creating endowments, managing funds, and awarding grants and scholarships. In the first year, following a

successful capital campaign, four foundation grants were awarded. Today, the Foundation manages funds in 16 endowments and has awarded 169 grants and 51 scholarships to educators across North Carolina.

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES – MARCH 6, 2025

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, hosted by the Littleton Group, met at Littleton Baptist Church on March 6, 2025. As members arrived, they enjoyed a time of fellowship and took care of various financial responsibilities and opportunities, including dinner cost; raffle tickets; GIRLS Fund through UNICEF USA; and Safe Alliance, the 2025 NC DKG Convention project.

President Sheila Robertson welcomed the membership and special guest and storyteller, Jim Hogan. Venue decorations celebrated the St. Patrick's Day colors of green and gold. Loree Harris gave thanks before the hearty meal prepared by several members of the Littleton Group. Attendees enjoyed a variety of homemade soups, green salad with all the fixings, crackers, tea, and water. An array of mouth-watering desserts completed the meal. The attendees showed their appreciation with a heartfelt round of applause.

Following dinner, entertainment was provided by Jim Hogan and member Diane Colin as they took the group on a tour of Ireland. Hogan regaled the group with tales of the Emerald Isle and how his grandfather and his grandfather's brothers traveled to America from County Tipperary, passing through Ellis Island. Using an Irish flute, Colin played melodies illustrating Irish reels, jigs, and hornpipe formats. Robertson presented each of them with tokens of appreciation for their preparation and performance.

President Robertson called the business meeting to order. Recording Secretary Evelyn Hall reported that attendance constituted a quorum with twenty-four members and one guest present. Minutes of the last meeting, which were printed in the March 2025 *Gamma Chi Newsletter*, were approved as printed. Treasurer Debra Clayton reported a checking account balance of \$2,172.53, and a savings account balance of \$9,906.82. The report was approved and filed for audit.

Corresponding secretary, Gail Coleman, reported sending a Get Well card to Katrinka Brewer for knee problems. She shared a note from Betsy Clark thanking the chapter for remembering her with a recent donation to the NC DKG Scholarship Fund and regards from Jill Coleman who was unable to attend the meeting because of her attendance at events surrounding the tragic loss of a young student at her school.

President Robertson recognized members who celebrate birthdays in January, February, and March with a gift choice of adult coloring book or various word find, puzzles, along with colorful, sharpened pencils. Robertson revealed Evelyn Hall as the Mystery Member for March.

President Sheila Robertson expressed joy in the chapter as she recalled completion and submission of the Chapter President 2024 Annual Report to NC DKG. Also sent in were the Order of the Rose for chapter achievement and Gamma Chi's nominations for the Golden Key Award: Evelyn Hall, and the Rising Star Award: Sara Council. The form for Communications Excellence has also been submitted. Robertson urged members to attend the 2025 NC DKG Convention, which is being held at the Hilton Charlotte University Place. Pride in Gamma Chi and fellowship with members from across the state make attending NC DKG conventions an incredible experience. She encouraged members to contribute to the Safe Alliance Convention Project and directed members who wished to lend support to sisters in Western North Carolina in the continued aftermath of Hurricane Helene to a suggested website for donation ideas. She reminded members that the DKG International Conference is in New Orleans, July 31-August 2. June 30 is the last day to take advantage of early-bird registration pricing.

Several committees made reports:

Educational Excellence: Nancy Tunstall, reporting on behalf of Chair Aimee Cooper, shared information about a new DKG International project to support girls in Africa through UNICEF's Girls Initiative to Revitalize Learning and Success (GIRLS) Fund. Through expanding educational access, improving educational quality, addressing girls' wellbeing and supporting their empowerment, the GIRLS Fund prioritizes efforts that enable all girls to complete secondary education and develop the knowledge and skills they need for life and work. Members generously donated \$105 to this worthy project.

Membership: Jenny O'Meara presented a motion that the chapter accept the resignation of Donna Liles. The motion passed. Chair O'Meara placed prospect cards at meeting tables to solicit names and contact information for potential new members to grow the chapter, but sadly shared news that she is resigning her current position as chair.

Scholarship: Chair Betsy Clark indicated that three applications were received for Grants-in-Aid. She recommended Macie Fleming, a Warren County Early College High School student planning to attend NCSU, and Tiffany Franks, a teacher assistant at Mariam Boyd planning to attend NCCU, each receive \$1,000 Nancy Blankenship Grants-in-Aid. The committee motion carried.

Afghan: Chair Danylu Hundley reported \$54.00 collected from raffle ticket sales. She reminded members that all monies and tickets are due at the May 15 meeting.

There were no other committee reports.

President Robertson called for reports on sick and reserve members. Dr. Sylvia Alston reported that honorary member Josephine Myrick is sick and unable to attend the meeting.

There was no unfinished business.

In new business, Nancy Tunstall made a motion that Professional Development Grants pay for registration and rooms for all Gamma Chi members attending the NC DKG Convention in Charlotte. These funds will also pay for meals and transportation for first-time attendees. The motion was seconded and carried. Danylu Hundley made a motion that children's books for distribution at the Santa House in downtown Warrenton during the Christmas season be collected at every meeting, with a special emphasis for collections at each December meeting. She mentioned that 100-150 books are needed, especially titles for older children. The motion was seconded and carried.

President Sheila Robertson reminded members of the awarding of grants to take place at the May meeting.

President Robertson adjourned the meeting after extending well wishes for a lucky St. Patrick's Day and Happy Easter to attendees.

The Littleton Group conducted the raffle with numerous members taking home prizes.

Descriptions of DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) Funds:

Cornetet Award — Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals (applications due November 1 & May 1) and for educational seminars (applications due November 1).

Educational Projects – Any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support encouragement and improvement of education. (Applications due March 1)

Educators Award – Selected women authors receive cash awards for non-fiction writing impacting education.

Emergency Fund – Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

ETH Leadership Fund – Supports superb speakers for international meetings and other leadership events.

Golden Gift Fund – Provides for a member to attend a one-week leadership/management training seminar usually held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas, at Austin in even numbered years (now called DKG Ignite).

International Speakers Fund – The purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our NC DKG Convention each spring. (Applications due September 15.)

World Fellowship Fund – Assists women from around the world to attend graduate school in the U.S. or Canada.

Scholarship Fund – Members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies). (Applications due February 1.)
