TREASURER'S REPORT by Shirley White, Treasurer



At the March meeting, \$70.00 was collected from the meeting raffle; this will be used to help our local libraries and the NC DKG Educational Foundation. Schools for Africa yielded \$85.00 in cash plus \$125.00 in personal checks for a total of \$210.00. What a wonderful way to lend a helping hand! Other money received was \$177.00 for the

afghan raffle, bringing the total to \$375.00. Another \$125.00 is needed from our members to reach our goal of \$500.00 to be raised by the afghan raffle each year to fund a grant-in-aid.

Thank you, Gamma Chi Sisters, for paying your dues in a timely fashion. At the present, we have forty-four active and thirteen reserve members who have paid their dues for a total of fifty-seven members. The budgets will reflect these numbers.



The Annual Report of the Treasurer (Form 15) was completed and sent in prior to the July 15 deadline to NC DKG Treasurer Leslie Black for compilation before being sent to International Headquarters. Also, the 990-N ePostcard was completed, filed and accepted by the IRS.

All bills for the 2019-2020 year were paid, with a balance of \$6,930.37 left in the checking account. Five grants-in-aid were paid, leaving a balance of \$4,395.74 in the savings account. The financial records were audited, and the records were found to be in good order.

INDIVIDUAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE SEPTEMBER 1

During 2018-2019, \$62,105.40 was awarded for Cornetet Individual Professional Development Grants (CIPD) from DKG International. There are three deadlines each year: September 1, February 1 and May 1.

Learn more about CIPD awards by going to the DKG Educational Foundation <u>website</u> and click on Apply. September 1 is the last deadline to apply for Cornetet Individual Awards for Professional Development for this year. Awards may fund travel, lodging, meals, pay for substitutes, registration fees, etc. Awards may not be used to reimburse for activities already completed, to pursue a degree program, or to fund an educational project. Also, scholarship and project monies are benefits of DKG membership. At least two of our members have received monies from the Society—Dr. Sylvia Alston received a DKG Scholarship to finish her doctorate degree, and Ashley Barnette received a CIPD to further her training. There are four categories for submission. They are:

- Visual including photography, 2D Art and 3D Art

COULD YOU USE \$500 OR \$1,000?



The Board of the NC DKG Educational Foundation continues to work diligently to fulfill its purpose of supporting

learning and literacy projects and the professional development of NC educators. For more information about these grants and an application, go to <u>http://www.ncdkgef.org/</u>, then click on Grants. Here is a summary of available grants:

New Educational Foundation grant opportunities for learning and/or literacy projects and for continuing education are now available. Grants of up to \$500 will be awarded in early November. The deadline for the Foundation grants is *September 30, 2020*.

The Groves-Little Endowment provides funds for the Groves-Little Early Career Educators grants. This grant opportunity is for teachers with four or less years of experience and supports literacy projects, learning projects, and continuing education for beginning teachers. The deadline for the Groves-Little grant is *September 30, 2020*. The endowment will award two \$1,000 grants.

The Maxine and Don McCall Educational Endowment funds the McCall Gifted Education or Fine Arts grants. This grant is available for teachers of gifted students and teachers in the fine arts. The deadline for the McCall grants is *September 30, 2020*. This endowment will award two \$1,000 grants.

The Margaret Church Endowment supports Leadership Development. This endowment makes it possible for teachers to attend personal leadership development classes or conferences, purchase leadership development instructional materials, or attend leadership development training for grades K-12 initiatives. This endowment will award up to \$1,000.

OUR CHAPTER ACHIEVEMENT

Since I was president when the NC DKG Chapter Achievement Form was first introduced, I've become very familiar with it. Its purpose is two-fold. First, it assists chapters in defining and collecting information about their status in accomplishing chapter activities and responsibilities such as chapter representation at various events, chapter communications, community projects, chapter strategic plan, chapter attendance, scholarships and awards presented, and contributions to and support of international and state activities/projects. Secondly, it acknowledges, recognizes and appreciates those chapters who meet the criteria at various levels of achievement.

Currently there are four achievement levels: Honorable Mention below 350; Distinctive 350+ points; Excellent, 475+ points; and Superior, 600+ points. Additionally, the Presidential Chapter Achievement Award is given to up to five chapters (possibly more if there is a tie) who score at least at the superior level and earn the highest number of points. These awards are usually presented at the annual spring NC DKG Convention in May. This year they were presented virtually due to the convention being cancelled because of COVID-19.



Points are accumulated from March 1 to the next March 1 with the form being submitted by March 1 each year. Gamma Chi has achieved the Presidential Award in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 and 2020. We barely missed it in 2016 due to increasing the points needed from 500 to 600, and in 2019 we

missed it by five points. We will strive to get it in 2021!!!

I am so proud of our chapter! We pulled together this year. *We amassed the most points ever*—730 *points!* This is an increase of 70 points over 2019. The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Littleton Baptist Church in Littleton, NC on Thursday March 5th, 2020, beginning with a social hour at 5:45 p.m. There were 28 members, and 1 guest present. Donna Liles led the program on the medical accomplishments of Cicely Saunders, the founder of modern hospice care. After the program, President Evelyn Hall convened the meeting. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written.

Shirley White presented the treasurer's report. The checkbook balance was \$2,870.78. The savings account balance was \$6,668.17. The report was received to be filed for audit.

Nancy Tunstall presented for the Membership Committee. Kathy Stewart was presented as a new member. Michele Stallings was welcomed as a reinstated member. Trina Paynter's request for reserve membership was read and approved.

Danylu Hundley presented for the Afghan Committee. She reported that the committee is on track to meet the \$500 goal. Also, she reported that she had delivered the children's book donations from the December meeting to L's Book Nook: Library/Resource Center in Hollister.

Betsy Clark shared that the Schools for Africa collection raised \$210.00.

President Hall spoke about the upcoming NC DKG State Convention. The chapter's deceased members, Nell White and Harriett Faulkner, will be recognized as a part of the remembrance ceremony.

Nancy Tunstall proposed that the chapter use professional development grant money to pay for the first six members to sign up for the NC DKG State Convention. The motion was seconded, voted on, and carried.

Evelyn Hall spoke about the DKG International Convention, and Aimee Anderson may attend the convention which will be in Philadelphia in July.

Two ad-hoc committees were created. First, Nancy Tunstall, Sheila Roberson, and Kathy Stewart will design a 27-inch tall display board and corresponding PowerPoint slide in order to "show how Gamma Chi GROWS" at the upcoming state convention. Diana Bobbitt, Evelyn Hall, Danylu Hundley, Shirley White, and Nancy Tunstall will form a second ad-hoc committee in order to brainstorm non-monetary gifts for the Blankenship family whom have given so much to the Gamma Chi Scholarship Fund.

President Hall recognized members with birthdays in January, February, and March. President Hall then closed the meeting by thanking the Littleton group. The Littleton Group conducted the raffle and members were dismissed.
