



LISA BENDER CHOSEN FOR LEADERSHIP RETREAT



Lisa Bender was one of twenty-six NC DKG members chosen to participate in the NC DKG Leadership Development Retreat, entitled "Rejuvenating the Leader within for Inspiring the Leader in Others" offered during the 2021 NC DKG Convention. All shared in being affirmed and encouraged to be the

courageous leaders that they are gifted to be. The experience was a balance of diverse presentations and journaling for epiphany moments, realizing giftedness for leadership. Each presenter mirrored personal strengths through yoga, courageous journeys from educators to new endeavors, daily journaling, and meditation. Lisa describes her experience as follows:

When I completed the application in late April for the leadership retreat at the DKG state convention, I was hoping to learn more about DKG, in general, and how to be a better leader, specifically. I have a strong spirit for lending a hand and joining in a team effort, but I don't think I'm an effective leader. I expected the retreat to be an intense leadership training with

an "if you believe it, you can achieve it," Tony Robbins-like power mantra. What I experienced in the retreat, though, was very nearly the opposite: various DKG leaders provided quiet, yet powerful, sessions which stressed the key to leadership is committed self-care for the leader.

Cynthia Moore, a director on the National DKG Board, and Judy Lasater, PhD, PT, led us through a yoga activity which helped us to relax and focus on our inner selves. The stretching and breathing exercises, performed from our desk chairs, modeled an "open heart practice;" Lasater shared her own wellness mindset, saying, "When I move at the pace of my body and not at the pace of my mind, I am happier." As we performed the various exercises, Lasater gave us the keys to self-care: move more; sleep well; drink plenty of water; practice gratitude; lead with joy; and take time for self-fulfillment.

In the "Leading from the Heart" segment, we attendees identified the essential skills for effective leadership: listening; working together; demonstrating respect; finding potential in others; showing courage in the face of adversity; and ensuring wellness (physical, occupational, intellectual, spiritual, emotional, and social) through reflective practices. One particularly memorable quote was, "Every time we are courageous, everybody else is braver."

In another session, we were encouraged to "shift from fear to love." Cynthia Moore spoke about how "perfectionism and fear are keeping people from learning and growing." We participants identified those activities which gave us energy as well as those which drained our energy. Our lists of energy boosters and energy drainers provided us with strategies to protect our leadership and personal energies. We discussed our individual needs to focus inward and to distance ourselves from outside pressures and influences (such as social media and the demands of others). Focusing inward allows us to rest and strengthen our resources; the demands and distractions around us, such as meeting others' expectations, erode our strength and personal resources, weakening us to the point we no longer have anything to give to others as leaders.

Our retreat sessions closed with drumming therapy and meditative yoga exercises which reinforced our commitment to self-care. After such a reflective and quiet day, I realized I—we—cannot lead and give strength to others (and our organization) if I am, or we are, drained of internal resources. I learned I must care for myself first in order to be able to care for others, especially those in our DKG organization and all others who count on me for personal and professional support.

When our retreat concluded, I could hardly identify what we had "done" during the sessions. Instead of being jam-packed with power ideas and "rah-rah" activities, the retreat at the State Convention was like a spa day: quiet, fulfilling, and restorative. The retreat was just what I needed to become the person and DKG leader I hope to be in the future.

Congratulations to Lisa for being chosen for this honor, and thank her for sharing her experience with us.



TREASURER'S REPORT

The Annual Report of the Treasurer for 2020-2021 (Form 15) was completed and sent in prior to the July 15 deadline to NC DKG Treasurer Leslie Black for compilation before being sent to International Headquarters. Also, the 990-N ePostcard

was completed, filed and accepted by the IRS.

All bills for the 2020-2021 year were paid, with a balance of \$4,772.56 left in the checking account. Six grants-in-aid were paid leaving a balance of \$4,546.52 in the savings account. The financial records were audited, and the records were found to be in good order.

The dues for 2021-2022 have been paid and sent to NC DKG and DKG International. With Shirley Cava requesting reserve status and Lynne Lassiter resigning, we have a total of 56 members (43 active and 13 reserve). The 2021-2022 proposed budgets, based on 56 members, is attached to the newsletter. The budgets will be presented for approval at our September 2 meeting.

At the September meeting when paying by check, please write **separate checks** with the **correct amount** for the meal, beginning teacher items, etc. It will make the bookkeeping so much easier!

CHAPTER RULES COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Several amendments to the NC DKG *Bylaws* and *Standing Rules* were made last spring at the NC DKG Convention. Once we obtain instructions as to how these amendments will affect our

chapter rules, we will be able to automatically align our chapter rules with the changes.

As approved at the Planning Meeting this summer, we will vote on having the chapter pay the membership dues for collegiate members. The rationale is that we, as a chapter, should help them since they have the burden of college expenses. The changes to our

chapter rules would be in **Article IV Finance B. Current Dues and Fees.** Changes are indicated in red:

- The international annual dues are \$40.00 for each active member and \$20.00 for each reserve and collegiate member (Gamma Chi will pay the collegiate member's international annual dues).
- 2. The state annual dues are \$15.00 for each active member, \$2.00 for each reserve, and \$5.00 for each collegiate member (Gamma Chi will pay the collegiate member's state annual dues).
- 3. The chapter annual dues are \$30.00 for each active member, \$15.00 for collegiate members and \$23.00 for each reserve member. These amounts are subject to change based on budgetary needs. A scholarship fee of \$1.00 per year and a headquarters fee of \$3.00 are included for active and reserve members. The chapter retains \$0.80 of the scholarship fee for the Gamma Chi Scholarship Fund.

OUR CHAPTER ACHIEVEMENT FORM

Since I was president when the NC DKG Chapter Achievement Form was first introduced, I've become very familiar with it. Its purpose is two-fold. First, it assists chapters in defining and collecting information about their status in accomplishing chapter activities and responsibilities such as chapter representation at various events, chapter communications, community projects, chapter strategic plan, chapter attendance, scholarships and awards presented, and contributions to and support of international and state activities/ projects. Secondly, it acknowledges, recognizes and appreciates those chapters who meet the criteria at various levels of achievement.

Currently there are four achievement levels: Honorable Mention below 450; Distinctive requires 450+ points; Excellent, 575+ points; and Superior, 700+ points. Additionally, the Presidential Chapter Achievement Award is given to up to five chapters who score at least at the superior level and earn the highest number of points. These awards are presented at the annual NC DKG Convention in April. Points are accumulated from March 2 to the next March 1 with the form being

NC DKG

submitted by March 1 each year. Gamma Chi has achieved the Presidential Award in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 and 2020. Last spring we received the Superior Achievement Award, but missed out on the Presidential Chapter Achievement Award. We definitely want it in 2022!!!

To reach that goal, we will need every member's help. Here are some ways you can help:

- > Do not resign—we will receive 10 points for having a net increase in membership (consider going reserve if you have extenuating circumstances); we need two more members to reach this goal
- ➤ Attend meetings—60% attendance earns us 15 points; 40%, 10 points; and 20%, 5 points (we only had 50.2% last year)
- Encourage members who have resigned to reinstate each reinstated member earns us 20 points with 40 points maximum
- Publish in the DKG Bulletin Journal (5 points), on an educational website (5 points), in a professional journal (5 points), and/or in the DKG Collegial Exchange magazine (5 points); be sure to let me know if you do
- Communicate with state/local officials (10 points; must send examples—if you email, send me a blind carbon copy as proof—this would be a good time to contact your legislator about your concerns in regard to education in the state)
- Apply for a state and/or international scholarship (5 points)
- Submit an application for a NC DKG Educational Foundation Grant (5 points—due September 30 and January 31)
- Present a workshop at the state convention (10 points) and/or be a facilitator for a workshop (5 points)
- Contribute to an DKGIEF fund (tax deductible) such as the, Cornetet Award, Educational Projects, Educators Award,

- Emergency, Eunah Temple Holden (ETH) Leadership, Golden Gift, International Speakers, or Scholarship (10 points)
- Contribute to an NC DKG fund such as the Leadership Fund and/or Scholarship Fund (20 points each)

If we all pull together, I think we can make it. Please let me know of any publications and/or applications you make. A copy of this year's form is on our website for your perusal, and can be accessed by clicking here. Thanks in advance for your assistance in helping our chapter to reach this goal.

COULD YOU USE \$500 OR \$1,000?



The Board of the NC DKG Educational Foundation continues to work diligently to fulfill its purpose of supporting learning and literacy projects and the professional development of NC educators. For more information about these grants and an application, go to http://www.ncdkgef.org/, then click on Grants. Here is a summary of available grants:

Educational Foundation grant opportunities for learning and/or literacy projects and for continuing education are now available. Grants of up to \$500 will be awarded in early November. The deadline for the Foundation grants is *September 30, 2021*. If you miss this deadline, grants will also be accepted through January 31.

The Groves-Little Endowment provides funds for the Groves-Little Early Career Educators grants. This grant opportunity is for teachers with four or less years of experience and supports literacy projects, learning projects, and continuing education for beginning teachers. The deadline for the Groves-Little grant is *September 30, 2021*. The endowment will award two \$1,000 grants.

The Maxine and Don McCall Educational Endowment funds the McCall Gifted Education or Fine Arts grants. This grant is available for teachers of gifted students and teachers in the fine arts. The deadline for the McCall grants is *September 30, 2021*. This endowment will award two \$1,000 grants.

The Margaret Church Endowment supports Leadership Development. This endowment makes it possible for teachers to attend personal leadership development classes or conferences, purchase leadership development instructional materials, or attend leadership development training for grades K-12 initiatives. This endowment will award up to \$1,000.

(Just as a side note, Diane Colin applied and received a \$1,000 NC DKG Educational Foundation Grant a couple of years ago which enabled her to purchase tall drums for Vaughan Elementary School's Global Arts Program. Also, applying for one of these grants earns our chapter points on our chapter achievement form. Please let Nancy Tunstall know if you do apply. Thanks!).

BUILDING LEADERS IN DKG



Willing, capable leadership is necessary on all levels of the Society: chapter, state organization, and international. It's important to build leadership from the ground up and to support the

development of future leaders. Here are some ideas for doing that.

- Identify future leaders early.
- Personally reach out to chapter members to encourage them to step out of their comfort zones. Don't give up on members too easily. Support and mentor!
- Challenge members to go beyond the chapter level and to attend conventions and/or conferences on the state organization and international level.
- Encourage chapter members to apply for scholarships and grants, for Leadership Management Seminars (on the state organization and international level), for state committees, for state officer positions, etc.
 Spotlight those who are successful in those endeavors.



GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – MAY 1, 2021

The Gamma Chi Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met virtually on May 1, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. There were 15 members and 5 guests in attendance.

President Evelyn Hall welcomed members to the zoom session. Mary Catherine Harris shared inspiration through poetry. The Scholarship Committee presented the grants-in-aid awards. Cornetet Award – Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals (applications due November 1 & May 1) and for educational seminars (applications due November 1).

Educational Projects – Any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support encouragement and improvement of education. (Applications due March 1)

Educators Award - Selected women authors receive cash awards for non-fiction writing impacting education.

Emergency Fund – Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

ETH Leadership – Supports superb speakers for international meetings and other leadership events.

Golden Gift Fund – Provides for a member to attend a two-week leadership/management training seminar held in early July at the McCombs School of Business, University of Texas at Austin in even numbered years.

International Speakers Fund – The purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our NC DKG Convention each spring. (Applications due September 15.)

Scholarship Fund – Members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies). (Applications due February 1.)
