

TREASURER'S REPORT

At the May meeting, \$110.00 was collected from the meeting raffle; this will be used to help our local libraries and the NC DKG Educational Foundation. Other monies received were

\$118.00 for the afghan raffle, \$450.00 for meals, and \$850.00 for dues.

The Annual Report of the Treasurer for 2021-2022 (Form 15) was completed and sent in prior to the July 15 deadline to NC DKG Treasurer Leslie Black for compilation before being sent to International Headquarters. Also, the 990-N ePostcard was completed, filed and accepted by the IRS.

All bills for the 2021-2022 year were paid, with a balance of \$6,183.01 left in the checking account. Four grants-in-aid, one professional development grant and meals for presenters and recipients totaling \$3,150.00 were paid leaving a balance of \$5,551.55 in the savings account. The financial records were audited, and the records were found to be in good order.

The dues for 2022-2023 have been paid and sent to NC DKG and DKG International. With Maryanne Edwards resigning and Robin Edwards becoming a collegiate member, we have a total of 62 members (44 active, 3 collegiate, 14 reserve, 1 honorary). The 2022-2023 proposed budgets, based on 62 members, is attached to the newsletter. The budgets will be presented for approval at our September 1 meeting.

At the September meeting when paying by check, please write *separate checks* with the *correct amount* for the meal, beginning teacher items, etc. It will make the bookkeeping so much easier!

COULD YOU USE \$500 OR \$1,000?



The Board of the NC DKG Educational Foundation continues to work diligently to fulfill its purpose of supporting learning and literacy projects and the professional development of NC educators. The deadline for the Foundation grants is **September 30, 2022**. If you miss this deadline, grants will also be accepted through January 31. For more information about these grants and an application, click here. Here is a summary of available grants:

Educational Foundation grant opportunities for learning and/or literacy projects and for continuing education are now available. Grants of up to \$500 will be awarded in early November.

The Maxine and Don McCall Educational Endowment funds the McCall Gifted Education or Fine Arts grants. This grant is available for teachers of gifted students and teachers in the fine arts. This endowment will award two \$1,000 grants.

The Margaret Church Endowment supports Leadership Development. This endowment makes it possible for teachers to attend personal leadership development classes or conferences, purchase leadership development instructional materials, or attend leadership development training for grades K-12 initiatives. This endowment will award up to \$1,000.

There will be other grants available in the spring. Information will be forthcoming.

(Just as a side note, Diane Colin applied and received a

\$1,000 NC DKG Educational Foundation Grant several years ago which enabled her to purchase tall drums for Vaughan Elementary School's Global Arts Program. Also, applying for one of these grants earns our chapter points on our ROSE Award. Please let Nancy Tunstall know if you do apply. Thanks!).

GAMMA CHI PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES – JULY 30, 2022

The Gamma Chi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Planning Committee held its biennial meeting in the conference room of Warren County Memorial Library on July 30, 2022, with past-president Evelyn Hall, assisted by Nancy Tunstall, presiding. Nancy Tunstall presented the Strategic Plan covering Purposes, Mission Statement, Vision Statement, Chapter Theme, Planning Process and Measurement, and Goals for the 2022-24 biennium. A motion by Sylvia Alston and a second by Sheila Robertson led to the approval of the Strategic Plan.

Following an overview of committee responsibilities, chairs or their substitutes made committee reports and received suggestions for changes in committee functions.

Awards - Nancy Tunstall reported for Ashley Barnette. Sylvia Alston suggested a change in the procedure for achievement recognitions at September meetings. Members receiving certificates and/or pins for Member Excellence, Perfect Attendance, and Milestones will receive these items when they register and pay for dinner. Descriptions of DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) Funds:

Cornetet Award — Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals (applications due November 1 & May 1) and for educational seminars (applications due November 1).

Educational Projects – Any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support encouragement and improvement of education. (Applications due March 1)

Educators Award - Selected women authors receive cash awards for non-fiction writing impacting education.

Emergency Fund – Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

ETH Leadership – Supports superb speakers for international meetings and other leadership events.

Golden Gift Fund – Provides for a member to attend a two-week leadership/management training seminar held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas at Austin in even numbered years.

International Speakers Fund – The purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our NC DKG Convention each spring. (Applications due September 15.)

World Fellowship Fund – Assists women from around the world to attend graduate school in the U.S. or Canada.

Scholarship Fund — Members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies). (Applications due February 1.)
