

TREASURER'S REPORT

At the May meeting, \$70.00 was collected from the meeting raffle; this will be used to help our local libraries and the NC DKG Educational Foundation. Other monies received were \$135.00 for the afghan raffle bringing the total collected to \$551.00;

\$225.00 for the meal; \$25.00 for a key pin and name tag/ ribbon;

and \$1,915.00 for dues (22 active and 1 reserve).

The Annual Report of the Treasurer for 2022-2023 (Form 15) was completed and sent in prior to the July 15 deadline to NC DKG Treasurer Leslie Black for compilation before being sent to International Headquarters. Also, the 990-N ePostcard was completed, filed and accepted by the IRS.

All bills for the 2022-2023 year were paid, with a balance of \$8,214.91 left in the checking account. A total of \$3,696.06 was paid for three grants-in-aid, eight professional development grants, and meals for presenters and guests leaving a balance of \$2,649.92 in the savings account. The financial records were audited, and the records were found to be in good order.

The dues for 2023-2024 have been paid and sent to NC DKG and DKG International. With Shirley Cava and Erin Riggan resigning, we have a total of 60 members (44 active, 2 collegiate, 13 reserve, 1 honorary). The 2023-2024 proposed budgets, based on 60 members, is attached to the newsletter. The budgets will be presented for approval at our September 7 meeting.

At the September meeting when paying by check, please write *separate checks* with the *correct amount* for the meal, beginning teacher items, etc. It will make the bookkeeping so much easier!

COULD YOU USE \$500 OR \$1,000?



The Board of the NC DKG Educational Foundation continues to work diligently to fulfill its purpose of supporting learning and literacy projects and the professional development of NC educators. The deadline for the Foundation grants is September 30, 2023. If you miss this deadline, grants will also be accepted through January 31. For more information about these grants and an application, click here. Here is a summary of available grants:

Educational Foundation grant opportunities for learning and/or literacy projects and for continuing education are now available. Grants of up to \$500 will be awarded in early November.

The Maxine and Don McCall Educational Endowment funds the McCall Gifted Education or Fine Arts grants. This grant is available for teachers of gifted students and teachers in the fine arts. This endowment will award two \$1,000 grants.

The Margaret Church Endowment supports Leadership Development. This endowment makes it possible for teachers to attend personal leadership development classes or conferences,

purchase leadership development instructional materials, or attend leadership development training for grades K-12 initiatives. This endowment will award up to \$1,000.

There will be other grants available in the spring. Information will be forthcoming.

(Just as a side note, Diane Colin applied and received a \$1,000 NC DKG Educational Foundation Grant several years ago which enabled her to purchase tall drums for Vaughan Elementary School's Global Arts Program. Also, applying for one of these grants earns our chapter points on our ROSE Award. Please let Nancy Tunstall know if you do apply. Thanks!).

OUR MEMBER BENEFITS FROM DKG EMERGENCY FUND

On May 10, we had a terrible storm to tear through our county. Unfortunately the storm tore the roof off of Sara Council's home, and she had severe hail damage to the siding of her home. She and her family were displaced for several days while tarps/etc. were placed on her house to prevent more water damage.

For many years our chapter has made annual contributions to the DKG Emergency Fund for members such as Sara. We are happy to announce that Sara was the recipient of a \$500.00 check from the DKG Emergency Fund to help with repairs. Here is what Sara had to say, "My family is very grateful for the money



we received from the emergency fund. It is an honor to be a member of an organization that is dedicated to supporting its members. This generous gift will help to further the repairs to our home and truly exemplifies the care and compassion of DKG and its members." DKG EMERGENCY FUND



As a valuable member of DKG you are eligible for a \$500.00 award from the Emergency Fund. If a DKG member experiences a major loss from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wildfires, or other natural disasters, their chapter

and state organization president may recommend they receive a \$500 award from the DKG Emergency Fund.

The process is user friendly. The chapter president informs the state organization president of member(s) impacted by a natural disaster. Then the state organization president electronically submits Form 84 to the Executive Director with the name of the member, member's chapter, current mailing address, date of the event, the exact natural disaster, and loss sustained. The Executive Director approves the request and sends a check from Society Headquarters to the member(s).

The DKG Emergency Fund has been responding to disasters since 1948. Following a 1948 flood that destroyed Vanport, Oregon, the *DKG News* asked for monetary donations to help affected members living in Vanport. More than \$3,000 was sent to headquarters to assist, and thus the Emergency Fund began.

From July 1, 2021, to April 15, 2023, DKGIEF awarded emergency funds totaling \$66,500 to 133 DKG members.

Members who have received assistance from the fund report how thankful they are for the help in a time of need, and appreciate how quickly it was received. Many are surprised, all are grateful.

The Emergency Fund is sustained totally from donations. A collection is held at international conferences. In addition, individuals, chapters, and state or province organizations may donate funds. Donations can be made to the Emergency Fund with a debit or credit card on the website under 'Donate to DKGIEF' or by sending a check made out to DKG Emergency Fund along with Form 43 from the site.



Gamma Chi Chapter Planning/Executive Board Meeting Minutes Saturday, July 15, 2023

On Saturday, July 15, 2023, Gamma Chi Chapter of DKG held its Planning/Executive Board meeting. It convened in the home of Dr. Sylvia Alston, Gamma Chi President, who called the meeting to order.

The first item on the agenda was Awards Committee. President Alston suggested that we continue the streamlining of the awards recognitions by placing placards listing Perfect Attendance, Member Excellence, and Membership Milestone recipients near the entrance. Norma Retzlaff will create the placards. Those receiving certificates and pins will pick them up at the hostess table. President Alston will present some awards. Nancy Tunstall made a motion to award DKG pins to active members and local pins to reserve members who reach 25 years and over milestones. Debra Clayton seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Beginning Teacher Support Committee Chair Norma Retzlaff commented that the list of items for new teacher support needs some adjustments, which will be posted on SignUpGenius.

President Alston led the discussion for the Educational Excellence Committee. The group discussed the necessity of members participating fully in the Afghan project through selling more tickets or making a donation without selling tickets. The committee will make memorial/honorarium Scholarship Contribution forms available at each meeting to encourage funding of these financial initiatives of Gamma Chi.

Those present discussed trying new songs from the DKG songbook or having a musical program and encouraging members to submit to DKG Fine Arts Gallery in the Music/Fine Arts area.

Chair Nancy Tunstall reported for Communications and Marketing Committee. These areas are going well and efforts will continue to get Gamma Chi's name and accomplishments into the public domain.

Shirley White, treasurer, reported for the Finance Committee. She presented proposed budgets for 2023-24 year. The Proposed Budget for Checking Account is based upon a July 1, 2023, balance of \$8,214.91. The Proposed Budget for Savings Account is based upon a July 1, 2023, balance of \$2,649.92. The dues portal will be due the following week. It will be reflected in the treasurer's report in September. The savings account disbursements will be affected by Scholarship Committee recommendations.

The Nomination Committee will prepare a new slate of officers for 2024-2026. Aimee Cooper and Rachel Smith will join Chair Ashley Barnette, Diana Bobbitt, and Kathy Stewart on the committee.

The Planning Committee did not schedule another meeting.

Chair Aimee Cooper will address Chapter Rules Committee activities to make certain that Gamma Chi Chapter Rules are in line with NC DKG amendments passed in April, 2023.

Discussion of the Hospitality Committee was led by Chair Debra Clayton. Concerns about the difficulties with entering and exiting current meeting locations, lack of convenient parking, and lack of technology may mean changing meeting locations. Debra and Rachel Smith will speak with the appropriate group location chairs.

Remembrance protocols will remain the same.

Gamma Chi Memorials will remain the same.

The planning participants agreed that the Afghan fund raising goal should be \$1,000.00 annually through more vigorous ticket sales and donations.

The participants agreed to continue existing projects.

The group also agreed that a prospective member should have a thorough understanding of the financial obligations of membership and that a mentor should be assigned to each new member.

Shirley White urged members to let her know about supply needs in time to include them in the budget. She also stated that reimbursement requests must be accompanied by a receipt and turned in to her no later than ten days after expenditure or May meeting, whichever comes first.

Nancy Tunstall reported that the Order of the Rose Award, which replaced the DKG Chapter Achievement Award, is much simpler. It is due March 1, 2024.

Debra White asked about the process for Gamma Chi members to sign on as volunteers for the 2024 state convention, which is in Durham and is hosted by Region III. President Alston will know details of Gamma Chi hosting responsibilities following the NC DKG Executive Board meeting September 16.

No other concerns arose.

President Alston adjourned the meeting.

Descriptions of DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) Funds:

Cornetet Award —Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals (applications due November 1 & May 1) and for educational seminars (applications due November 1).

Educational Projects – Any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support encouragement and improvement of education. (Applications due March 1)

Educators Award - Selected women authors receive cash awards for non-fiction writing impacting education.

Emergency Fund – Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

ETH Leadership Fund – Supports superb speakers for international meetings and other leadership events.

Golden Gift Fund – Provides for a member to attend a one-week leadership/management training seminar usually held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas, at Austin in even numbered years (now called DKG Ignite).

International Speakers Fund – The purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our NC DKG Convention each spring. (Applications due September 15.)

World Fellowship Fund – Assists women from around the world to attend graduate school in the U.S. or Canada.

Scholarship Fund – Members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies). (Applications due February 1.)
