

Committee activities were discussed, programs for the upcoming meetings were reviewed, and current projects will continue at the same level of funding as last year.

President Sheila provided attendees with a great variety of delicious snacks and drinks. A joyful work session was had by all.

TREASURER'S REPORT

At the May meeting, \$83.00 was collected from the meeting raffle; this will be used to help our local libraries and the NC DKG Educational Foundation. Other monies received were \$180.00 for the afghan raffle, \$450.00 for the meal, \$45.00 for the Scholarship Fund, and \$1,835.00 for dues.

The Annual Report of the Treasurer for 2024-2025 (Form 15) was completed and sent in prior to the July 31 deadline to NC DKG Treasurer Tonya Allison for compilation before being sent to International Headquarters. Also, the 990-N ePostcard was completed, filed and accepted by the IRS.

All bills for the 2024-2025 year were paid, with a balance of \$5,942.75 left in the checking account. A total of \$4,281.61 was paid for three grants-in-aid and five professional development grants leaving a balance of \$4,941.60 in the savings account. The financial records were audited, and the records were found to be in good order.

The dues for 2025-2026 have been paid and sent to NC DKG and DKG International. With Paula Aycock, Lisa Bender, Shannon Fuller, Pattie Rodwell and Michele Stallings resigning, we have a total of 49 members (37 active, 11 reserve, 1 honorary). The 2025-2026 proposed budgets, based on 49 members, is attached to the newsletter. The budgets will be presented for approval at our September 4th meeting.

At the September meeting when paying by check, please write **separate checks** with the **correct amount** for the meal, beginning teacher items, etc. It will make the bookkeeping so much easier!



DON'T FORGET TO BRING YOUR CHILDREN'S BOOK(S)

ever, this requirement was dropped several years ago and **DKG DOES NOT** require voting on new members.

While DKG has dropped the voting requirement, the DKG Constitution states under Article III Membership Section C Election, "A candidate for active or collegiate membership shall be selected by the method established by the chapter's rules."

Many chapters are changing their chapter rules to eliminate voting on members.

Remember, members who recommend prospective members know the people they are recommending so if someone is recommended by a member, they should be encouraged to attend the orientation and join the Society. We should all work to make the Society as welcoming as possible. Being open and receptive to those who want to join should be a priority for everyone.

INCREASING MEMBERSHIP MUST BE STRATEGIC

All chapter members must work on chapter membership. Your first chapter program this fall might need to be a "Membership Work Session" for your members. Conduct brainstorming in small groups then have each group share those ideas. Next, develop action steps for committees or small groups to complete. Include dates to check in on the progress toward the goals.

At each meeting, have a "potential member" time on your agenda so potential members are a focus at every meeting. If your chapter has mostly retired members, what strategies will help you reach potential members who are currently working? Do you need to invite a school or system administrator to join since she will know many potential members who are currently working?

Remember to invite non-traditional educators. Look for potential members at churches, hospitals (ex. those who teach classes for new moms), 4-H or other county agencies, historical sites, etc. To increase membership, make a strategic plan, divide the work so all are involved, then watch your chapter grow.

There are four categories for submission. They are:

- Visual including photography, 2D art, 3D art, Al art, and digital art

- Music including original composition and oratory

CREATING A GOOD MENTORING RELATIONSHIP

It is important for members to embrace the opportunity to serve as a mentor to others. By doing so, it helps DKG continue to maintain a strong, sustainable Society.

Rest assured, a mentor does not need to have all the answers. You must remember that a mentor only needs to be a supportive person who can build a relationship with a mentee by

offering her guidance, support and encouragement as the mentee learns more about the Society and/or her new DKG leadership role. Although being a mentor does take some time, planning and commitment, it doesn't have to be all business and no fun!

So, you accepted the responsibility to mentor a new inductee or a member serving in a new DKG leadership position. Your willingness shows the mentee that she matters... NOW WHAT?

The first thing you want to consider doing is to get to know one another both personally and professionally. Start creating a trusting relationship by building a good rapport with one another.

Plan a time to meet, either in-person or via ZOOM. Perhaps the first time you get together, maybe over coffee, just have a good conversation - share about family, interests and experiences, motivations and/or goals. Getting to know one another will help you as a mentor decide what kind of information will be helpful to your mentee.

It's important that the mentee voice what she wants to learn from you. She may have many questions to ask. The best thing to do is to decide on one specific topic and/or goal to work on each time you meet to narrow the focus. It will help both of you to stay on point.

During this age of COVID, many of our DKG educators have been overwhelmed with the increasing list of duties and

challenges. They often become frustrated because it's hard to devote the attention or energy to their students. Serving as a positive mentor may just be the ticket for helping to make a difference to those members who seek a listening ear.

GAMMA CHI CHAPTER PLANNING/EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Minutes July 26, 2025

The Gamma Chi Chapter Planning/Executive Board convened on July 26, 2025, at Hardware Café at 3:00 p.m. in Warrenton with President Sheila Robertson presiding. After calling the meeting to order, she followed the Meeting Agenda distributed by Nancy Tunstall.

As a reminder, each committee should meet and set biennium goals. The group discussed each committee's responsibilities and concerns.

Awards – Chair Dr. Alston stated that nominations for the Golden Key award and the Rising Star Award will be presented at the September meeting. Because of a glitch in the last submission process, the previous nominees will be resubmitted again for this award cycle. Membership Milestones, Member Excellence, and Perfect Attendance certificates and pins will be awarded at the September meeting. Members wishing to display a larger array of pins may purchase new ribbons or reinforce existing ribbons on name tags. Per drawing, Diane Colin's meal will be free at the September meeting. Member Excellence forms will be distributed through the newsletter.

Beginning Teacher Support – Chair Norma Retzlaff reported that the New Teachers Bag Project would continue. Nancy Tunstall will create a SignUpGenius for members to select what they will bring to the September meeting. Suggestions were made to select supplies available in compact packaging and to consider larger bags when reordering to facilitate easier distribution. Monetary donations for the purchase of supplies will again be accepted. There was discussion of other activities to emphasize Gamma Chi to new teachers. The discussion was tabled with no further action.

Educational Excellence (EEC) – The group addressed Gamma Chi meeting dates and programs resulting in the following schedule:

- (1) September 4, 2025 Recognitions: Member Excellence, Milestones, Perfect attendance; Program: NC DKG Educational Foundation member Sharon Frazier (as a representative of NC DKG leadership)
- (2) December 4, 2025 Program: Gift exchange (\$10 maximum) with Santa, Christmas music
- (3) March 5, 2026 Program: Warren County Farmer's Market Manager Tamara Small; Voting on Scholarship/Grant recipients and new officers
- (4) May 14, 2026 Induction of new members, installation of new officers, presentations of scholarships and grants-in-aid

Educational Law and Policy — Nancy Tunstall reported that after the NC DKG US Forum Representative and the NC DKG Educational Law and Policy chair are selected, she will share their reports with the membership via email and/or newsletter articles. She also encouraged attendance at the National Legislative Seminar (NLS), March 8-11, 2026, in Old Town Alexandria, VA.

Membership – As there is no current committee chair, Melanie Burnette was recommended for the role. Dr. Sylvia Alston volunteered to serve as co-chair. The group discussed the continuation of the recruit, reinstate, and retain emphasis, seeking out women to recommend for membership, and completing or updating member's biographical sketches for tributes. There was a discussion of reserve membership requirements, but no action was taken.

Scholarship – Chair Betsy Clark reported the need for continued emphases on members applying for local, state (NC DKG Educational Foundation grant applications deadline is September 30), and international scholarships and for members to encourage students and teacher assistants to apply or reapply for grants-in-aid.

Music/Fine Arts – In addition to a musical program during each year, Sheila Robertson encouraged members to make submissions to the DKG Fine Arts Gallery. Submission date windows are August 15 through September 15, 2025, and January 15 through February 15, 2026.

Communications and Marketing — Chair Nancy Tunstall reported that publicity efforts will continue with newspaper articles and brochure distribution. The updated picture directory and biennium yearbook are available and will be updated as needed.

Finance – Nancy Tunstall reported that work on the budget is complete based on 37 active, 11 reserve, and one honorary member.

Nominations – In the absence of Chair Sara Council, the group emphasized encouraging current officers to serve a second term and/or to train those who will replace current officers. Slate of officers should be presented at the March 2026 meeting.

Planning - The committee should meet in summer 2026 to plan the new biennium.

Chapter Rules – Chair Norma Retzlaff reported that a review is necessary before the end of the biennium. Chapter should consider changing the requirement to vote on new members since it is no longer required by the DKG *Constitution*.

Hospitality – Chair Debra Clayton reported that dinner meetings will continue with the current schedule and locations. The cost for meals may need attention and price containment measures, such as member preparation of desserts, could be employed.

Remembrance – Sending of birthday cards to all members and Christmas and Easter cards to reserve members will continue.

Gamma Chi Memorials – Upon the death of a member(s), the memorial books will count as the Warren County Memorial Library donation.

Afghan – The committee will conduct the raffle as in 2025. Danylu Hundley may address any changes.

The group approved continuation of the following Gamma Chi projects for the 2024-2026 biennium.

- a. New Teacher Bag Project: \$100 plus donations by members
- b. Scholarship of \$1,000; Grants-in-Aid of \$1,000; Professional Development Grant of up to \$500
- c. Warren County Memorial Library donation or memorial gift of \$75
- d. Littleton Library donation of \$50
- e. American Cancer Society (Relay for Life) donation of \$50
- f. World Fellowship donation of at least \$100
- g. GIRLS (at least \$100) from donations
- h. Children's books donated by members at each meeting; suggested donation to the Warren County Santa House in Warrenton
- i. Meeting Raffles to finance donations to local libraries and to DKG Educational Foundation (at least \$50)

Committee chairs should notify Debra Clayton or Nancy Tunstall of any supply needs.

Nancy Tunstall reported that the Order of the Rose due date is March 1, 2026. Successful completion should not be a problem.

Sheila Robertson adjourned the meeting.

Descriptions of DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) Funds:

Cornetet Award –Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals (applications due November 1 & May 1) and for educational seminars (applications due November 1).

Educational Projects – Any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support encouragement and improvement of education. (Applications due March 1)

Educators Award – Selected women authors receive cash awards for non-fiction writing impacting education.

Emergency Fund – Members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization president to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award

ETH Leadership Fund – Supports superb speakers for international meetings and other leadership events.

Golden Gift Fund – Provides for a member to attend a one-week leadership/management training seminar usually held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas, at Austin in even numbered years (now called DKG Ignite).

International Speakers Fund – The purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an ISF at our NC DKG Convention each spring. (Applications due September 15.)

World Fellowship Fund – Assists women from around the world to attend graduate school in the U.S. or Canada.

Scholarship Fund – Members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctoral studies). (Applications due February 1.)

Proposed Amendments

Article III Membership A. New Member now reads:

A. New Member

- 1. Invitations to membership may be issued after chapter vote at any time throughout the year.
- 2. The Membership Committee shall have available Prospect Cards at every meeting for any chapter member who wishes to nominate a candidate for membership. Prospect Cards are also available online at our website.
- 3. These Prospect Cards may be completed and returned to the Membership Committee at any meeting. The Membership Committee shall then present the nominee(s) for vote by members.
- 4. After the presentation any member has the opportunity to speak on behalf of the nominee(s).
- 5. At the end of the discussion each prospective new member is elected by majority vote of the members present.
- 6. An invitation for orientation is delivered by the chairman of the Membership Committee or her designee to each nominee.
- 7. At the orientation those present should include, if possible, but not be limited to, the nominee(s), the Membership chair, the president, the treasurer and a current member assigned to each nominee, probably the nominee's sponsor. Other current members may attend. At the end of the orientation, each nominee must either accept or decline membership. If the nominee accepts membership, she must complete a Chapter Member Application Form.
- 8. An individual becomes a member of the Society when she pays her dues. She may begin attending meetings immediately after payment of dues.
- 9. The chapter will encourage the new member(s) to participate in an induction ceremony and accompanying celebratory meal.
- 10. A member who joins the Gamma Chi Chapter becomes a member of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International and NC DKG.
- 11. A member may submit a recommendation for membership to any chapter.

The Rules Committee proposes eliminating the requirement of voting on new members. If approved, the section, **A. New Members**, would now read as follows:

A. New Member

- 1. The Membership Committee shall have Prospect Cards available at every meeting for any chapter member who wishes to nominate a candidate for membership. Prospect Cards are also available online at our website.
- 2. These Prospect Cards may be completed and returned to the Membership Committee at any meeting.
- 3. Upon receiving a Prospect Card(s), an invitation for orientation is delivered by the chairman of the Membership Committee or her designee to each nominee.
- 4. At the orientation those present should include, if possible, but not be limited to, the nominee(s), the Membership chair, the president, the treasurer and a current member assigned to each nominee, probably the nominee's sponsor. Other current members may attend. At the end of the orientation, each nominee must either accept or decline membership. If the nominee accepts membership, she must complete a Chapter Member Application Form.
- 5. An individual becomes a member of the Society when she pays her dues. She may begin attending meetings immediately after payment of dues.
- 6. The chapter will encourage the new member(s) to participate in an induction ceremony and accompanying celebratory meal to be held annually as necessary.
- 7. A member who joins the Gamma Chi Chapter becomes a member of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International and NC DKG.
- 8. A member may submit a recommendation for membership to any chapter.
