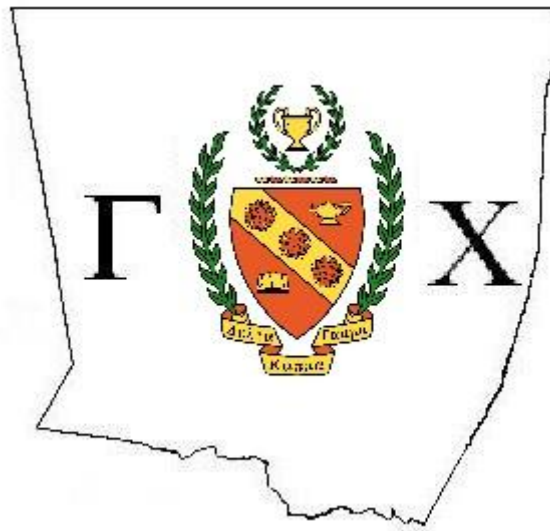

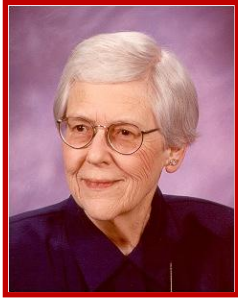

The theme for the 1998-2000 biennium under President Harriett Faulkner was “Education in a Global Community: Collaborate, Communicate, Commit, For an Optimal Future.” We continued to support literacy in the state, and gave financial support to our Warren County School System,

President Faulkner reminded the members of the Seven Purposes of our Delta Kappa Gamma Society International as well as our Ten Membership Promises. These aspirations bear reviewing so that we might continue to grow and reach heights acceptable by the group.
