Eta State Convention Report by President Nancy Tunstall



Our convention theme is "Cherish the Past, Celebrate the Present, Commit to the Future." This theme complements Eta State's theme of "Embracing Our Vision•Designing Our Future—Lead Serve Impact." As your president, I have attended four of the five planning sessions with Connie King attending the one that I was unable to attend. It has been a very rewarding experience to see what goes into producing a quality convention. The twelve chapters in our region have worked very diligently to accomplish this task. I want to bring you up-to-date on some of the details.

We are privileged to have Dr. Beverly Helms, International Second Vice President, as our International guest speaker. She resides in Florida and has received many accolades throughout her

career, not the least of which is her nomination for International President for the 2012-2014 biennium. I look forward to seeing her again this summer at the International Convention in New York City from July 24-29.

On Friday, April 27, there will be a pre-convention workshop from 10:00-1:00 entitled "Designing Women in Leadership" which will begin at the Department of Public Instruction with the State Superintendent Dr. June Atkinson along with other successful women in leadership roles from various fields. The event will end at the Governor's Mansion for a reception and will include lunch. Registration for this event and further information will be in the Spring *Eta State News* and also online. There will also be some tours available for Friday afternoon. Friday night's Opening Session from 7:30-9:00 includes recognitions of chapters, individuals, a speaker and entertainment. There will be door prizes.

Saturday begins with an extensive breakfast buffet including omelets to order (for those staying at the hotel). The opening Session from 8:00-11:00 includes business, entertainment and a speaker. In the afternoon you will be able to choose from a wide variety of workshops or some very interesting tours including the Orchid Trail in Morrisville, a guided tour of the NC State Arboretum, an independent tour of the History Museum, afternoon high tea at The Umstead and other tours. The day concludes with the Presidents' Banquet at 6:30. I will proudly march in carrying the Gamma Chi flag. I hope you will be there to see our flag. Be on the lookout for really nice table favors!

Sunday morning begins with the Ceremony of Remembrance at the nearby North Cary Baptist Church. At the service our own Lorraine Porter will be remembered along with other departed Eta State sisters. We will return to the hotel for the Sunday Brunch to wrap up the convention. Again be on the lookout for nice table gifts. Also, there will be door prizes.

We have many responsibilities for this convention. We are in charge of the Silent Auction Baskets to raise money for the Eta State Leadership Fund. This fund enabled two of our members, Debra Clayton and Maggie Shupe, to attend the Leadership Seminar last summer at a greatly reduced price. I have prepared a sign for the tables and posters to place in various locations to remind people of the auction. I will also have a bid sheet and a contents card for each basket. We will be responsible for locking up the baskets on Friday night and displaying them again on Saturday.

A very important part of our duties is to provide hostesses. Each of the twelve chapters in Region III is asked to provide eight members to serve as hostesses. Our Region III Director Connie Woody will develop a list of jobs/responsibilities/time slots. More details will be forthcoming. Attending the convention and helping out by being a hostess will be a great opportunity for all of our members, especially our newer members, to get the big picture of who we are and what we do to make a difference. Please let me know if you are going. We already have three members who have registered. I would like to see many more register and attend. We can carpool and bunk together to save on the expenses or you can go just on Saturday.
