

#### GAMMA CHI CHAPTER MINUTES – MARCH 7, 2013

The Gamma Chi Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met on Thursday, March 7, 2013 at Robinson Ferry Restaurant in Warrenton, North Carolina. Brooke Comer gave the blessing and we enjoyed a delicious meal.

After dinner, Nancy Tunstall, President called the meeting to order. Thirty-nine members were present. Mary Catherine Harris gave our inspiration, *The Circle of Life*.

After making the following correction, "Connie King reported that she took 290 box tops and 341 points in labels for education collected at our last meeting to Northside Elementary School . . . ," the minutes were approved. Treasurer, Shirley White, reported a savings balance of \$4,439.86 and a checkbook balance of \$1,402.27.

Corresponding secretary, Sallye Duncan, reported the following regrets: Harriet Banzet, Melanie Burnette, Louise Mitchum, Ginny Bernard, Renee Mizelle and Paige Lamberson. Thank you notes were received from South Warren teachers Sharon Moore and Kathryn Carter for the new teacher goodie bags and from Nancy Tunstall for the World Fellowship contribution given in her honor.

Our February, March and April birthdays were recognized. Dr. Janis Meek was recognized for being the Founders Award nominee. This is the highest award that Eta State bestows and is given only once every two years. The recipient will be announced at the Eta State Convention. Also, Shirley White was recognized as our Golden Key nominee, which will also be announced at the convention.

The minutes of the Executive Board meeting were reported by Jeffrey Evans. The Executive Board discussed and approved the following items to be brought to the chapter's attention: that our chapter pay for two hotel rooms for members attending the Eta State Convention, pay the Convention registration for two of our newer members who would commit to being officers and award a Professional Development Grant to Jessica Williams, a beginning teacher at Vaughan Elementary School, to attend the Beginning Teacher strand of the Leadership Development Seminar being held this summer. The Executive Board made a motion that we pay for two hotel rooms if needed and the fee to attend the Eta State Convention for two of our new members who would commit to being officers. The motion carried. If any member is interested in attending the convention under these stipulations, please see Nancy as soon as possible. First come, first serve. To honor our commitment to the International Beginning Teachers Project, the Executive Board made a motion to award Jessica Williams a Professional Development Grant for \$185.00 to attend the Beginning Teacher strand of the Leadership Development Seminar this summer. The motion carried. Nancy encouraged members to apply for the Professional Development Grant if we are interested in attending the Leadership Development Seminar.

Nancy Tunstall gave the President's Report. In completing the Chapter President 2012 Annual Report, Nancy was able to answer in the affirmative for all questions. The report was filed ahead of the due date. The 2012 Annual Necrology Report listed our two departed sisters for last year, Ethel Draper and Betsy Little. Betsy Little's memorial service will be held at our May meeting. The Eta State Recognition of Chapter Achievement form and the supporting documents have been completed and our chapter accumulated 510 points to qualify for the Superior Achievement Level. We will receive that award at the spring convention and will receive the President's Award if we are among the top five highest scorers. Janis and Shirley have sent in their Founders Award and Golden Key award packets respectively, and recipients will be announced at the convention, as stated earlier. Nancy urged our group to attend the Eta State Convention. The fellowship is incredible and the pride you will feel as Gamma Chi is recognized for their achievements will be heartwarming. Nancy passed out extra registration forms which should be submitted before April 5 to receive the reduced rate. Nancy will be conducting a workshop at the convention on Saturday afternoon entitled *How to Motivate Member Excellence* using our chapter as a model.

### **Committee Reports**

**Awards**: Janis Meek thanked Nancy for inspiring us. She urged member to complete their Member Excellence form and turn it in at the May meeting.

**Beginning Teacher Support:** Mary Austell prepared forty-two cards of encouragement for new teachers in Warren County. THAT forms were submitted in December, but may be submitted to Mary Brodie Raiford at any time.

**Educational Excellence**: Mary Brodie Raiford reported on the Schools for Africa. Thanks to Delta Kappa Gamma International and others, the Schools for Africa program is: benefiting nearly 5 million children with a special emphasis on girls, orphans, and children living in extreme poverty; increasing access to basic education in Africa's 11 poorest countries; building and rehabilitating almost 1,000 schools; training nearly 100,000 teachers; supplying notebooks, pens, desks, chairs, and other essential school materials; making sure schools have clean, safe drinking water and separate bathroom facilities for boys and girls; and creating schools that offer a protective environment.

**Educational Law and Policy:** Legislative proposals should have been received.

**Membership:** Nancy reminded us of changes in our Chapter Rules concerning election of new members. According to Article III Membership, Section A. 4., 5., and 6., the Membership Committee presents the names of the eligible nominees for the chapter's consideration. After the presentation any member has the opportunity to speak on behalf of the nominee(s). At the end of the discussion each prospective new member is elected by majority vote of the members present. Patricia Williamson presented Maryanne Henry, Heidi Hogan and Tracey Neal as candidates for membership. Several members spoke on behalf of the three candidates. They were all elected for membership. Orientation will be arranged and those accepting membership will be initiated at the May meeting.

**Scholarship**: Mary Ann Johnson made a motion from the Scholarship Committee that we renew Morgan Leigh Coleman's grant-in-aid and give Melissa Hunter and Brooke Sikes, both high school seniors, a grant-in-aid. The motion was carried. Grants-in-aid will be presented to the recipients at our May meeting and their pictures will be taken for a newspaper article.

**World Fellowship**: Loree Harris reported that there are three World Fellowship recipients from North Carolina: Weeda Zabith at UNC-Chapel Hill and Fatima Hashmi and Zainab Moulvi both at Duke. Birthday cards will be sent to them from our chapter and we will look into inviting them to attend one of our chapter meetings in the future.

**Music**: Karen Paynter shared the answers to the Musical Instruments brain teaser that had been passed out at the beginning of the meeting.

**Communications and Publicity**: In Trina Paynter's absence, Nancy encouraged us to look at the recent online version of the *Eta State News* found at the Eta State website. She distributed a copy of it with references to Gamma Chi marked. The deadline for submitting articles for the next *Gamma Chi Newsletter* is April 9. Committee reports and news articles are welcomed. Also, anything relevant to education that you would like to share with our members would be appreciated. We would like to thank the e-buddies for sharing the newsletter with members who do not have an e-mail account.

Finance: No report.

**Nominations:** Connie King reminded us that a slate of officers will be presented March, 2014. Please give sincere thought to serving in one of these offices. Nancy will be glad to train our next President.

Planning: No report.

**Chapter Rules**: Mary Catherine Harris reported that mention was made in the *Eta State News* of Region III being the first region to have all of their chapters' rules approved.

**Hospitality and Social Affairs:** Paula Aycock thanked the Warrenton group for hosting tonight's meeting together with the delicious meal and reminded us that St. Paul's group will host our May meeting.

**Telephone Network Committee:** Kristen Boyd thanked all the telephone chairpersons for their prompt accounting.

**Remembrance Committee:** Shirley White reported that Christmas cards were sent to reserve members as well as birthday cards to all members.

Gamma Chi Memorials Committee: No report.

**Afghan Committee:** Danylu Hundley thanked members who purchased a ticket for the afghan. Remember, this money supports our chapter scholarships/grants.

#### **Description of International Funds**

**Educational Foundation Fund** – any educator may apply for project grants. Projects must meet one or more of the following: (1) Support and encourage intercultural understanding, (2) Encourage standards of excellence in education, and (3) Assist and cooperate with schools, colleges, universities and other persons, organizations, trust funds or foundations in support, encouragement and improvement of education. Also Cornetet funds are available for professional development for individuals and for seminars.

**Emergency Fund** – members who sustain major losses from floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, wild fires and other natural disasters may be recommended by their chapter and state organization presidents to receive a \$500 Emergency Fund Award.

**Golden Gift Fund** – provides for a member to attend a two-week leadership/management training seminar held in early July at the Red McCombs School of Business, University of Texas at Austin in even numbered years.

**International Speakers Fund** – the purpose of ISF is to facilitate exchange of Society speakers among member countries and help unite women educators of the world. The ISF committee considers requests for ISF speakers from state organizations twice annually. We have an IS at our Eta State Conventions each spring.

**Scholarship Fund** – members may apply for a \$6,000 scholarship to assist them with their graduate studies (\$10,000 for doctorial studies—just approved at the 2012 International Convention).
