I hope to honor Jess McBride's legacy with this article, so I will begin with a brief introduction to this very special Mu Chapter member. Jess was a member of Delta Kappa Gamma International Society for Key Women Educators for 47 years. She began her membership in a chapter in Mu State, in Florida, and served as the Mu State President from 1983-1985. When she moved to North Carolina, she became a member of Mu Chapter, where she served our chapter in many capacities, including serving as treasurer and the chair of the publicity committee for many years. She was honored as a "Treasured Rose" by Mu Chapter in 2007. Mu Chapter was very blessed to benefit from the many ways Jess contributed to our chapter until her death in December 2011. Her influence continues to be seen beyond Mu Chapter and Eta State, as Dr. Beverly Helms, International President of Delta Kappa Gamma, acknowledges Jess as a special person who helped to encourage her as a DKG member.

I owe Jess and our Delta Kappa Gamma sisters much because I received 4 scholarships from this organization. In each case, it was Jess who provided the motivation I needed to apply for the scholarships. Thus, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage my Mu sisters who are seeking advanced degrees at the Master's or Doctoral level to apply for scholarships. Jess brought me paper application forms for scholarship opportunities. The organization now provides electronic copies of the applications, so I am bringing e-copies to you. Note: Eta State members may apply for both an Eta State and an International Scholarship within a given year. The membership requirement for International applicants is three (3) years and for Eta State applicants is two (2) calendar years.

Your action will help me to express my gratitude to Jess and to all sisters in the Delta Kappa Gamma International Society for Key Women Educators. Protocol for Political Contacts

As Eta State seeks to influence legislative_decisions at local, state, and national levels, it is important that we acknowledge the purposes of our Society and the dignity of our profession. With this purpose in mind, members are asked respectfully to remember the_following guidelines:

- All Eta State communications with legislators and staff will be cordial and professional
- When we are representing DKG, we will confine our remarks to the issues identified by the membership. Other issues may be addressed at a different time and as individuals or members of another group.

- We will educate ourselves on the specific legislation/policy to be addressed as well as appropriate background to support our position.
- All Letters to the Editor addressed to local newspapers/news sources will be submitted after the approval of the local chapter.

*We suggest all letters be reviewed by an additional reader.

*In order to reassure members, chapters may prefer all letters to the editor be signed by retired members.

*Copies of all Letters to the Editor will be sent to the Eta State President prior to being sent to newspapers.

• When attending meetings with office holders either locally or in their legislative offices, members will wear their membership pins.

All emails regarding political activity will be sent to members' personal email addresses and not to email associated with a school system or state agency.
