It is hard for many today to comprehend the struggles these women went through to form a women's organization.

DKG did not just suddenly start on May 11, 1929. Dr. Blanton had spent months of careful thought and planning before her invited colleagues arrived to help establish an organization for women educators. She wanted the organization to be composed of members from all fields of education and the eleven ladies who accepted Dr. Blanton's invitation were that. Some women educators refused her invitation due to negative attitudes expressed by many concerning women's organizations. Discrimination within the teaching profession was the rule rather than the exception during this time. Some feared job repercussions; others shared the thinking of many of the men educators who were opposed to women organizing. This did not deter these women, for they saw little opportunity for women to learn leadership skills in the already established organizations run by men. But these women pushed on with their organization with confidence and a desire for its success. I wonder how many of us would be willing to make that first step toward becoming Women Leaders in Education?
