## Pre-Conference Tours

Friday, May 1

### #1 Shakespeare Theater Play

Meet in front of the Angus Bowmer Theater in Ashland to join your Delta Kappa Gamma sisters for a matinee presentation of Oregon Shakespeare Festival's very first musical production, *The Music Man*. A Delta Kappa Gamma greeter will hand each person a small packet of places to shop, visit, and eat in Ashland after the play, along with places to eat around the Red Lion in Medford (for those who want to get back and register for the convention after the play).

Tickets are \$47, and we have only 19, so register early! It must be noted that the play begins at 1:30 and there is NO late seating allowed, so you must be able to be in Ashland by 1:00 to attend the play. Cost is \$47.00.

### #2 Winery Tour

This will be the only bus tour. The yellow school bus will leave the Red Lion at 2:30. First we go to Edenvale Winery for a tour of the historic Voorhies mansion, a short introduction to our local wine industry, and six tastes of their wines. Then we go across town to the Roxy Ann Winery and orchards for wine tasting and a talk on the history of the farm. After tasting, we will have a cheese, fruit and bread buffet with an opportunity to buy a glass of wine, for our light supper. Cost is \$30.00.

### #3 Harry and David

This is a tour that leaves four times a day from the Harry and David Country Store at the South Medford Interchange, just about one mile south of the Red Lion. The buses leave at 9:15 and 10:30 AM and 12:30 and 1:45 PM. The tour goes to the factories, candy and bakery shops where all those delicious goodies are created. Tickets are \$5.00 and may be redeemed for credit on purchases in the store after the tour. Participants may do this on their own or with friends. No need to register in advance. Later you will be able to enjoy Medford's fine restaurants for dinner.

### #4 Jacksonville

This is another tour you can do on your own. The entire town of Jacksonville is on the National Register of Historic Places. There is a trolley that circulates around the town and explains the history to passengers. The town is full of galleries, wonderful shops and fantastic restaurants, as well as a Museum and Children's Museum.
