## **DKG Introduces New Recruitment Plan for Chapters**

Beta Epsilon's own **Dr. Elaine Alexander** is serving as the Xi State Membership Chairman for the 2015-17 biennium. She shared the following about a new initiative from International to help chapters find and initiate new members.

International has recommended that we gather the names of as many possible members, vote, and then invite them to an orientation / introduction to DKG. If they are interested, we would give them the information about the December initiation meeting and welcome them right then and there.

Texas, Washington (state), and Pennsylvania have added literally hundreds of members using this plan. The state membership committee members will work with every chapter this year explaining and supporting chapters to implement the plan. Tennessee lost 239 and added only 149 last year, so we are not replacing the people who drop their memberships.
