BACKPACK PROJECT


Our backpack project was once again very successful and CAM was super appreciative! Fifteen members participated to provide thirteen backpacks stuffed with supplies!

Beta Tau Chapter Delta Kappa Gamma Meeting Minutes for April 26, 2025 MacArthur Park Lutheran Church 2903 Nacogdoches Road San Antonio, TX 78217



During a period of social time, ladies signed in and received their name tags. Fifteen members were in attendance, including longtime member Charlotte Hains Gates.

President Teressa Lowrance called the meeting to order at 10:22 a.m. She pointed out the survey about membership and programs on the back of the agenda. Those could be filled out at the meeting or returned to her at presbetatau@gmail.com which is her email address.

Brenda Krueger gave the devotion based on the idea of Sabbath and giving yourself permission to rest. She followed the reading with a prayer for protection and peace for teachers.

Door prizes for this meeting were provided by Patty Raney. Winners were Suzette Price, Carolyn Dahlgren, Kathy Moran and Ann Carter.

President Lowrance gave an update on the health status of Myrna Burkes, her daughter and granddaughter and on Bel Rocha's sister Odette. Cathy Criner reported on Texas State President Bonnie Moore's progress after her car accident and on former President Marilyn Gregory's recovery after her automobile accident. Price relayed information to the group that Rose Bradley's brother had died unexpectedly. Prayers were requested for all of these ladies.

Lowrance gave the Beta Tau Key Women Educator Award in Chapter Service to Kathy Moran who was not able to attend last month when the other awards were presented.

The Founder's Day Luncheon is May 3, 2025, and the Beta Tau Chapter is to provided the table decoration which is to honor Mamie Sue Bastion, a Delta Kappa Gamma founder. Lowrance asked for help on gathering items for the centerpiece. She is providing one basket for the silent auction, and another basket is being donated by Patty Raney and Ginny Stowell. Beta Tau can have up to four baskets, and the proceeds come back to the chapter. Scotta Williams gave an oral list of those who have paid to attend the event.

Jeanette Pierce told that our scholarship recipient, Patricia Flores is working on her teacher certification through the "Texas Teachers" certification program. She will receive the \$500 scholarship in the fall. Pierce then gave information about the "Educational Savings Account" bill that has been passed by the Texas Legislature and signed by Gov. Abbott. The <u>education savings account (ESA)</u> program, also known as a school voucher program, is designed to provide funding for families to choose private schools or homeschooling. SB 2. The program is <u>capped at \$1 billion in its first year</u>. Families can use the funds for private school tuition, homeschooling expenses, and other approved educational costs. Pierce suggested that Beta Tau members look for more information in publications such as Texas Monthly and The Texas Tribune. More information could be found through teacher unions and organizations such as the American Federation of Teachers, Texas State Teachers Association, Association of Teachers in Public Education, etc. A list of all bills proposed before the end of the current legislative session is available at Legiscan. LegiScan LLC is an impartial and nonpartisan legislative tracking, reporting and data service utilizing LegiScan GAITS and LegiScan API.

Treasurer Williams reported that 22 members have paid their chapter dues including Jeannette Ferguson who was previously approved for reserve status. Available cash in the checking account on April 26, 2025 is \$4,336.75. She said that at this point there are six members attending the June 24-27 Texas State Convention in Denton. May 15 is the deadline for registration for the event.

Beta Tau member Patty Raney presented a show and tell of items she had collected during her 16 years of living in Okinawa.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:55 a.m.



FAVORITE RECIPE By Kathy Helmke

MOM'S BANANA BREAD

Cream first: 1 c. Sugar, 1/2 c softened butter

Add: 2 eggs, 2 t. Vanilla, 1 c. Ripe mashed bananas (usually 2)

Combine & add: 2 c flour, 1/2 t. Baking soda, 1/2 t salt, 1/4 t. Nutmeg, 1/4-1/2 t. Cinnamon

Optional: 1 c. Chopped walnuts or pecans,
