Cheesy Artichoke Squares

2 8 oz cans crescent dinner rolls 3/4 c shredded mozzarella

3/4 c grated Parmesan 1/2 c mayonnaise

1 14 oz can artichoke hearts drained/chopped

1 4 oz can green chilies drained/chopped

1 dash hot pepper sauce 1 4 oz can sliced black olives

Unroll crescent dough into rectangles and press into sides and bottom of jelly roll pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes. Combine the remaining ingredients in a bowl and mix well. Spread the mixture onto the crust. Bake at same temperature for additional 15 minutes or until cheese melts. Let stand 5 minutes before cutting into squares and serving. Makes about three dozen squares. If you wish to make ahead, it may be frozen before baking. Yummy as an appetizer; also a hit on a buffet.
