

APPLE CRISP

5-6 thinly sliced apples 3/4 c brown sugar 1/2 t ground cinnamon

3/4 c quick rolled oats 1/2 c regular flour one stick butter/margarine

Arrange apples in pan. Combine all other ingredients. Sprinkle over apples. Bake 34-40 minutes at 350 degrees. Yum.

CREAM CHEESE CORN

2 lb bag frozen corn Salt/pepper to taste

8 oz cream cheese

Cook corn in smallest amount of water possible just until tender. Drain. Add cream cheese & stir until melted. Add salt/pepper to taste. So easy!

CAROLYN'S EASY CHICKEN

4 large boneless chicken breasts 14 oz package chipped beef 8 slices thick bacon can undiluted cream of mushroom soup

1 c sour cream

Wrap each beast with bacon. Cover the bottom of a flat greased 8X12X2 baking dish with the chipped beef. Arrange chicken breasts on top of chipped beef. Mix the cream of mushroom soup & sour cream together & pour over chicken. Cover and refrigerate. About 3 1/2 hours before serving time, heat oven to 275 degrees. Bake uncovered for 3 hours. Hope y'all like it - my family does.
