

Carolyn Smith shared a devotional with a message from Bel Rocha thanking us for prayers and comfort in the loss of her sister and asking for continued prayers.

Summer Convention reports were given. Jeannette Pierce updated us on our newest DKG president Dr. Stacey Arnold whose theme is "Dare to Dream" and -Aspire, Cultivate Growth, Thrive. Kay Aguilar spoke of enjoying the convention and taking in the sessions about using "Ice Breakers" to possibly enhance meetings of each chapter. Myrna Burkes encouraged all members to attend future conventions to meet people from all over the state, making life long friends. She also asked for continued prayers for her family. Carolyn Dahlgren shared about being a cancer survivor telling about a "Tumor Bank" which results in a study of DNA of collected tumors that may report any continued problems. This shows how medicine is advancing.

Committee Reviews: President Teressa shared that we will have an active Necrology chairperson. Ann Carter is updating the Beta Tau newsletter on our website and in the process of updating logos. A blank was left for "Chapter Projects" which could be for members who have classroom needs or chapter needs. Discussion was held on how to help teachers with funding needs. The members will approve or disapprove the request. It was seconded by Jeanette Pierce. The motion was approved as was the budget. Discussion followed regarding a potential project requested by Teressa Lowrance for the purchase of a camera, tripod, and clothing to be used in her classroom to give students. She will bring details with costs to the next meeting for chapter consideration. Another discussion was on 2 reserve members who were not present needing to pay dues. Two of our members agreed to pay their dues. Kathy Moran will note in our next newsletter about requests for classroom needs. ASTEF funding was also discussed. The meeting was adjourned.


